



This year's Peace Poster Contest theme is "Dare to Dream." The theme allows young people, ages 11 through 13 by Nov. 15, to put their dreams into pieces of art.

Please, if at all possible, provide the poster board for the young people. If the poster board is not the appropriate size, the entry will be disqualified. The smallest size allowed for poster boards is 13 by 20 inches. The largest size is 20 by 24 inches.

Artists are encouraged to use bright colors, animals, symbols, flags and other ideas. **Numbers, letters and names are not allowed on the front of the poster.**

Your club's winning poster must have the sticker (that is in the kit) filled out and placed on the back of the lower right-hand corner of the poster. You can order kits by calling up shop.lionsclubs.org, and searching for Peace Poster kits. They are \$11.95 per kit. Kits must be ordered before Oct. 1.

Each winning Lions club poster will be judged at the state convention, where we hold our district judging. All club winning posters must be delivered to me (Carla Lein) by Oct. 15, or they can be taken to the state convention.

The state convention is scheduled for Oct. 20-21 in Minot.

The first- and second-place finishers from 5NE will go on to the Multiple District 5 Council of Governors meeting. There, the winning MD5 poster will be chosen. That MD5 winning poster will go on to the International Peace Poster competition. The grand prize in international competition includes \$5,000 plus travel to the awards ceremony at Lions Day with the United Nations.

The 5NE Lions Essay Contest will also be judged at the state convention. The Essay Contest is for young people visually impaired. Essays must also follow the "Dare to Dream" theme and must be 500 words or less per essay.
