





The Scrapbook of the District winner will be submitted to MD-4 for participation at the next annual MD-4 Convention.

- 1. The President's year shall begin with the election and will end on June 30th of the following year.
- 2.The Scrapbook shall first have won the District level contest. The Scrapbook can then be completed by June 30th. There will be three awards for the MD-4 contest, a winner and two honorable mentions. Awards will be presented at the MD-4 Convention the following February.

## Awards: First and second in each category:

Small club: 20 members or less members

2. Medium club: 21 through 35 members3. Large club: 36 members and over

#### Rules

1. Contest runs from May 1, 2022 through April 30, 2023.

- 2. To have a valid entry in club contest, a minimum of 8 official visits must be made and reported on the club's Inter-Club Activity Report form.
- 3. Official visit can be to any lions club within District 4-L1, a Student Speakers Contest, Christmas party or fundraiser.
- 4. Attending a joint meeting will only count as one visit.
- If two or more visits are made by the same person on the same day to clubs with overlapping meeting times, NONE of these visits will be deemed official.
- 6. Clubs may make multiple visits at the same time as long as no single individual is at more than one meeting.
- 7. An official visit requires three (3) members.
- 8. No more than two (2) visits to each Lions club will count.
- 9. Each official visit counts 25 points.
- 10. 50 extra points for visiting every club in your Zone.
- 11. 50 extra points for visiting every club in your Region.
- 12. 100 extra points for visiting every club in District 4-L1.

## **Inter-Club Activities Borrowing Rules**



The purpose of "Borrowing" is to generate good feelings and fellowship. The practice of Borrowing" another Lions Clubs paraphernalia shall be regulated in accordance with the following rules:

- The only paraphernalia which may be borrowed is the club bell.
   Once the bell is in the hands of a "borrower" it shall be
   considered in his club's possession, without contest, until
   retrieved in accordance with Rule 6. The practice of chaining
   down or otherwise anchoring the bell does not render this rule
   ineffective.
- 2. No other paraphernalia shall be "borrowed".
- 3. The Club Bell shall not be "borrowed" at any time other than during a regular meeting of the home club. For the purpose of this rule a regular meeting does not include occasional meetings such as Charter Nights, Governor's Visitations, Zone, Region, or District meetings.
- 4. Any Lions Club "borrowing" a Club's Bell shall notify the home Lions Club of its whereabouts within ten (10) days of the "borrowing."
- 5. No cash value shall be placed on the redemption of the "borrowed" Club Bell other than to pay for engraving.
- 6. When the home Lions Club visits the "borrowing" club, the Club's Bell shall be returned at that time. Should the visitation not be made within sixty (60) days, the "borrowing" Lions Club shall return it to the rightful owner.
- The only engraving to be done on a "borrowed" bell is the home Lions Club's current President's name and the year he is serving.

## **Lions Long Tail Award Rules**



**OBJECTIVE:** To visit all Lions Clubs but ONE in District 4-L1; no time limit to complete the visitations.

- 1. The awards will be given in two categories:
  - a) Club award to each Lions Club completing official visitations to a regular, charter night, officer installation, fundraiser, Student Speakers Contest or Christmas Party night of all but ONE club in District 4-L1.
  - b) **Individual** award to each Lion completing visitations to a regular, charter night, officer installation fund raiser, Student Speakers contest or Christmas Party meeting of all but ONE club in District 4-L1.
- 2. If two or more visitations are made by the same individuals the same day to clubs with overlapping meeting times, all those visitations are void.
- 3. The District Governor's official visitation does not count toward a Long Tail Award **for the** District Governor.
- 4. No time limit to complete the visitations.
- Each club or Lion will keep his/her own records of the visitations.
- 6. When the visitations are completed, turn in the record to your Region Chair through your club Secretary.
- 7. Region Chair will forward the records to the Inter-Club Activities Chair.

#### **Lions Short Tail Award Rules**



**OBJECTIVE**: To visit District 4-L1 Lions Clubs in the region as listed below **in one year**:

**Metro Region:** Any 10 clubs belonging to Metro Region (personal selection)

**Valley Region**: Any 10 clubs belonging to Valley Region (personal selection)

**Desert Region**: All clubs in the Desert Region **Sierra Region**: All clubs in the Sierra Region

- The awards will be given in two categories:
  - a) A Club award to each Lions Club completing official visitations (see Official Club Visitation Rules) to a regular, charter night, officer installation, fundraiser, Student Speakers contest or Christmas Party meeting of all clubs in any given region in District 4-L1 (region as defined above).
  - b) An Individual Lion Award to each Lion completing visitations to a regular, charter night, officer installation, Student Speakers Contest or Christmas Party meeting of all clubs in any given region in District 4-L1.
- 2. If two or more visitations are made by the same individuals the same day to clubs with overlapping meeting times, all those visitations are void.
- 3. The District Governor's official visitation does not count toward a Short Tail Award **for the** District Governor.
- 4. Visitations must be completed between May 1, 2022 and April 15, 2023.
- Each club or Lion will keep his/her own records of the visitations.
- When the visitations are completed, turn in the record to your club Secretary. Records received after April 30, 2023 will not be counted.
- 7. Club Secretary will forward the records to the Region Chair to be forwarded to the Inter-Club Activities Chair.

### Official Club Visitation Rules

- 1. Small clubs: Two (2) members making each visitation
- 2. Medium clubs: Three (3) members making each visitation
- 3. Large clubs: Four (4) members making each visitation
- 4. Visitation records will be maintained by the club Secretary
- 5. Records will be submitted to the District by the Secretary

#### **Individual Visitation Rules**

- Individual club members making visitation will maintain records within the District.
- An Individual making visitations outside the District will obtain an attendance note signed by the President or Secretary (club name and date).
- Records will be given to the Secretary for admission to the District.

#### **Lions Ambassador Award**

**OBJECTIVE:** To visit all Lions Clubs in any Region of District 4- L1 other than the Region to which his/her club belongs, in one year. Metro and Valley Regions require ten (10) clubs each.

- 1. The award will be given in two categories:
  - a) Club award to each Lions Club completing official visitation to a regular, charter night, officer installation, fundraiser, Student Speakers Contest, or Holiday party meeting of all clubs in any region or his/her own region in District 4-L1.
  - b) Lion award to each Lion completing visitations to regular, charter night, officer installation, fundraiser, Student Speakers Contest or Holiday Party meeting of all clubs in any region or his/her own region in District 4-L1.
- If two or more visitations are made by the same individuals the same day to clubs with overlapping meeting times, all those visitations are void.
- 3. The District Governor's official visitation does not count toward an ambassador **for the** District Governor.
- 4. Visitations must be completed between May 1, 2022 and April 15, 2023.
- Each club or Lion will keep his / her own record of the visitations.
- When the visitations are completed, records will be given to the club Secretary; records received after April 30, 2023 will not be counted.
- 7. Club Secretary will send the records to the Region Chair.
- 8. Region Chair will send records to the Inter-Club Activities Chair.

#### **Lions Nomad Award Rules**

**OBJECTIVE**: To visit twenty (20) Lions Clubs within Lions International within two (2) years.

- 1. The Award will be given in two categories:
  - a) Club Awards to each Lions Club completing official visitations to a regular, charter night, officer installation fundraiser, Student Speakers Contest or Holiday party meeting of selected clubs within Lions Clubs International.
  - b) Lions Awards to each Lion completing an official visitation to a regular, charter night, officer installation, fundraiser, Student Speakers Contest or Holiday party meeting of selected clubs within Lions Clubs International.
- 2. If two or more visitations are made by the same individuals the same day to clubs with overlapping meeting times all visitations are void.
- 3. Of the 20 clubs at least one club, but more than one may be outside District 4-I 1.
- The District Governor's official visitations do not count toward a Nomad Award.
- When visiting clubs outside District 4-L1, obtain an attendance note signed by the President or Secretary (club name and date).
- 6. Each club or Lion will keep his/her own record of its visitations.
- 7. When the visitations are completed, records will be given to the club Secretary.
- 8. The club Secretary will forward records to the Region Chair.
- The Region Chair will forward the records to the Inter-Club Activities Chair.

## **Peace Poster and Essay Contest**

\*Peace Poster Contest: For over three decades, Lions clubs around the globe have been sponsoring a very special art contest in schools and youth groups. Creating peace posters gives children everywhere the chance to express their visions of peace and inspire the world through art and creativity.

The contest runs from January 15 to November 15 of each year. Students ages 11, 12 or 13 as of November 15 are eligible to participate in the International Peace Poster Contest.



\*Essay Contest: The Peace Essay was created to give an opportunity for visually impaired young people to express their feelings of peace. The International Essay Contest is a staple of Lions clubs around the world. Lions work with local schools and area families to identify young people who are interested in participating and who could benefit from this program. One grand prize winner will receive an award and US\$5,000.

- 3. Elected Vice District Governor
- 4. Immediate Past District Governor
- 5. Cabinet Secretary Treasurer
- 6. Region Chair
- 7. Zone Chair
- 8. Immediate Past Club President
- 9. Club Vice President
- 10. Club Secretary
- 11. Seating: If spouses are present, they should be seated next to their partners at the head table.

**Protocol and Assist**: Greet the Governor and assist with luggage and setting up the banner. Escort the Governor to his/her seat and provide the agenda. Stand when the District Governor is introduced. After the program, assist by taking and packing the banner as well as helping the Governor with his/her belongings. While a gift is optional, remember that a sincere thank you note is not required, but should be mailed.

**Introduction**: The Club President/Meeting Chair introduces the Zone Chair, who in turn introduces the Region Chair. The Region Chair introduces the visiting Vice District Governor, members of the Cabinet from the person with the lowest rank in their order of precedence, to the person with the highest. When spouses are present, they should be introduced with the Lion member (i.e., "District Governor, John Doe and his wife Mary.")

## Club Dues Invoicing 2022-2023 Treasurer, Kyle Studebaker

District and Multiple District-4 dues (AKA "Per Capita Tax") invoices are sent to the clubs twice a year from the MD-4 Office. Each month the District Cabinet receives an aging report and is responsible for collection calls.

- Invoices are payable upon receipt
- The MD-4 and District annual dues are billed twice a year in August and February
- The MD-4 dues are \$18.00 (\$9 per member, twice a year)
- MD-4 collects the District Dues; the amount is collected on behalf of the club's district.

Please check your district constitution and bylaws.

The MD-4 constitution states that the billing is based on the number of members listed on the June and December membership reports. All classifications of membership in International must pay MD-4 dues except for Students. This includes life members and the affiliate member as well as family.

(The International (Illinois) dues are \$43.00 a year. International dues are separate from Multiple District-4, California.)

The MD-4 and District calculate dues in six month increments. Clubs should collect member dues before the impending bills.

#### Semi-annual Billing Breakdown

- Dues are for the periods of July-December and January-June
- Club treasurers should expect dues invoices to arrive in mid-August and mid-February
- Numbers are based on the LCI June and December Monthly Membership Reports
- If membership changes negatively, and the July or February membership report reflects that change, MD-4 will accept the alteration. MD-4 does not prorate.

The MD-4 invoice includes dues for the sub-District and the Multiple. Make the check payable to MD-4 not the sub-district. The sub-District portion of the funds are returned to the district treasurer monthly by the MD-4 office, 129 Los Aguajes Avenue, Santa Barbara, CA 93101-3817.
