The amazing thing is that our similarities and differences all happen at the same time. We all have the heart of a Lion, however the way we get things done varies from club to club.



The ideas are only limited by your imagination.

One of the ways that Lion Jennifer and myself are wanting to create a legacy is in the children of our schools. Lions do a great job already in the schools with our vision screening programs, but we can do more.

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Governor School, the partners in service (the spouses and other life partners of the District Governors) were challenged by Lions Clubs International First Lady, Lion Dianne Corlew, to become a "Partners in Education" or Π (Get it? PIE).

Π stems from the time when a little boy growing up in Tennessee was struggling in school. It was determined that his vision was poor and he needed to be referred to the Tennessee School for Blind. The only problem was that the boy could not be admitted because he didn't have a week's worth of clothes. Students stayed at the school during the week and went home on the weekends, and this boy didn't have a week's worth of clothes. The local Lions Club heard about this and bought the boy a suitcase and filled it with a week's worth of clothes.


The boy went on the graduate from the school and went to college, which eventually led him back to the blind school where he was the dean for nearly 30 years. All this because a Lions Club helped in the most innocent of ways. Wow, what a legacy.

Lion Dianne's challenge was to find a way to impact a local school. Maybe supplying something as little as paper and pencils or backpacks with food. One idea was sending home a box of cake mix, some icing, and some birthday candles so that a child come celebrate their birthday.

Lion Jennifer contacted our local school and found out that they needed shoes. Not expensive shoes, but just ordinary shoes. From that "Shoes for Schools" has been born with the cooperation of our home club, the Martinsville Noon Lions Club and the Martinsville Noon Lions Foundation.

This is what we're doing, and Lion Jennifer would love to hear what your club is doing jennifer.drapalik@sbcglobal.net. 



Since the early 2000's, the Lions of Indiana have raised close to **\$615,000** through club donations, the LCI/Anthem project and LCIF grants --- funds used to enhance the learning/living experiences our State's blind and visually impaired students.

YOU ARE AWESOME!!!

Jim Durst, ISBVI Superintendent, states that *"You have had a truly positive impact on the school's ability to provide services. The finances and manpower provided by the Lions has greatly assisted us in fulfilling our mission of providing quality learning, living programs and opportunities for Indiana's blind/low vision students."*



ISBVI FACTS

- ISBVI currently serves 430 students through on and off campus programs throughout the State
- Majority of students, including infants/toddlers, are served by ISBVI teachers in local communities
- Six travelling outreach consultants/teachers and 3 ISBVI Short Course teachers serve 300 students (including 33 infants) in the State

WHAT'S HAPPENING?

- Several new Smart Boards (grant from IN. Blind Children's Foundation and funds from LCI) have been installed/in use
- October 24 – International President Corlew/Lion Dianne Corlew and several District Governors visited the School. IP Corlew installed the officers of the Leo Club and presented at check for \$3,500 for the purchase of a smart board. He also toured the school and even rode one of the trikes around the Letterman Track.
- Cane Quest – February 10-12 at ISBVI...orientation/mobility contest for students grades 3-12

WHAT ARE YOUR TRUSTEES DOING?

- Brian's Trike Race – thanks to your participation and support, this event outperformed its budget. Next year, the timing of this event may be changed to take into consideration the trimester system being implemented in many local schools.
- November 12 – Lions/Anthem Volunteer Day (sponsored by the Speedway Lions Club) – A number of ISBVI trustees and Speedway Lions assisted approx. 60 Anthem volunteers in updating one on-site house used for intensive independent living experiences for senior students. Work included painting interior walls/outside porch and air vent, cleaning inside air return vents, cleaning flower beds, removing unwanted brush from around the house, raking leaves and mulching. A new refrigerator, microwave, blinds, and steel front door were purchased along with general work supplies such as paint. The initial grant was for \$1,000, but once LCIF/Anthem saw the project scope, this was increased to \$2,000! Anthem has indicated that they would like to do this again in 2017, and the Speedway Lions have agreed to sponsor the event.
- A spring 2017 workday at the school will be announced shortly.

Please encourage your clubs to contact their district trustees. Find out what your trustees and the school are doing for our State's blind/visually impaired students and how they can help.

Lions Clubs International has announced that effective July 1, 2017 membership initiation fees for a new member joining an ***existing club*** or the fee for a Charter shall be consolidated into a single category called “Entrance Fee.”

- All new members joining after July 1, 2017 will pay a \$35 entrance fee
- This is the first fee increase since 1993
- The entrance fee increase will support the development of:
 - o Enhanced new member kit with ongoing new member communications and tools
 - o Upgraded MyLCI 2.0 to provide members a destination to track their activities and engage with other members
 - o New service programs to support the new global service framework rollout
 - o A mobile app for members to serve on the go
 - o Digital LION magazine including mobile magazine app

ENJOY WINTER ---- THINK SPRING!

Wow, next week it's supposed to be close to 60°! So, it's time for all of us to start thinking about Spring events... fundraisers, service projects and membership drives. Everyone is eager to be outside right now being active, so plan a service project and ask for community help...put a help wanted ad in the local paper, ask your local radio station to do a service announcement or put up help wanted posters around town. Bring new folks into your circle of kindness...let them know their efforts are valued, let them see how much those we help appreciate Lions' efforts to ensure their needs for vision, food and warmth...basic needs are being met. You'll quickly identify those who have Lions hearts and once you do, remember to invite them to join you in future projects. As an added incentive, until June 30, 2017, our entrance/join fee is still \$25, but after that (effective July 1) this will be increased to \$35. A \$5 increase doesn't seem like much (two cups of coffee!), but this may be good motivation for some to sign their application for membership. By the way, this additional \$5 in the entrance fee does bring other benefits.....see following announcement from LCI.

While taking a few minutes out recently for a cup of coffee and to catch up with Martha Stewart, I saw listed her "Keys to Success." And as usual, I saw where these could equally be applied to Lions and our clubs, especially **membership growth and retention**. So here they are (with a ***Lions focus***):

1. Build your success on something you love (***service to others***)
2. Focus your attention on the basic things that people need and want (***vision, hearing, food, FUN***)
3. Create a plan that allows you to stay true to your big idea and focus on the details --then be flexible to change as it grows. (***service projects and fundraisers***)
4. Teach so you can learn (***educate your club members to everything Lions do and personal growth opportunities***)
5. Use smart, cost effective promotional techniques (***local paper/TV/radio service announcements, flyers, posters, handouts, club website and Facebook page ----- ask for help***)
6. Strive for quality in every decision, every day (***if your club members do what they like to do – they will do it well***)
7. Build an A-team (***recognize members' talents/ideas -- make them part of the team***)
8. So, the pie isn't perfect? Cut it into wedges (***don't overload dedicated members --- retain them by making sure the pie is always divided into reasonable wedges***)
9. Take risks, not chances (***new members will challenge the old ways and suggest new opportunities.... keep an open mind and support their enthusiasm.....and keep them engaged!***)
10. Make it beautiful (***let your club be a beacon of light in your community***)

As Lions, we are all about SERVICE -- remember that sometimes just a smile or "good morning" is a form of Service and giving.


