As we close out February and another month of 100% Monthly Membership Report and 100% Service Activity Report filing, I wish to congratulate all the club secretaries, and DG Ross, for showing that you care about what these reports mean—that your clubs are active in your communities! The Indiana First Vice District Governors finished off their state and area District Governor training this month. My understanding is that eyeglasses cannot be reused by anyone else other than for whom they are prescribed in the United States, but there is no such regulation in Mexico. So, don't throw away those old eyeglasses!! Recycle them!

You still have time to register for the 2017 District 25C Convention which will be held Saturday, March 11th at Turkey Run State Park Inn. Come and join the fun and camaraderie of meeting with other Lions in your District. Our speaker will be Lions Club International Director Bill Phillipi. There will be an informal "Meet the ID" at the Clinton Lions Club on Friday night.

The Indiana Lions Multiple District 25 State Convention is coming soon as well, April 28, 29 and 30 in Evansville. If you haven't already registered, there's still time! Centennial Celebration – Celebrating in Your Community

Here are some suggestions from the MD25 Centennial Committee for ways that your Lions Club can celebrate the Centennial in your own community:

1. **Electronic signs:** Start now to identify where electronic (or manual) signs are in your city, town or neighborhood. Find out who to contact about having a simple congratulatory message posted on that sign. Focus on the official Centennial Day of June 7th or that week or the month of June. There should be no cost to your club. Take a picture of each sign with the message posted and it will be published in a special edition of the ***District 25C Chronicles***. Free advertising for the company posting the sign, too!
2. **Indiana Lions Statewide Service Day (June 10, 2017):** Each club can plan a two-hour work project of their choice in their community that would fit into ONE of the four Centennial service challenge categories (Vision – Youth – Environment – Hunger). Try to get media coverage for the event to promote your project. If possible, contact your public officials to get a proclamation declaring **Lions Service Day**.
3. **County Fairs (July 2017):** Sponsor a booth at your county fair to promote your local club and LCI's 100th Anniversary. Have club membership information available and give away balloons, brochures, etc. Centennial items and other Lions items can be purchased from the LCI website (www.LionsClubs.org) or get items wherever you choose.
