

He applied for a Leader Dog. One day of his month's training with his new partner, Maddy, he was led to the back of a Target store and told to walk to the front. With Maddy's help he walked there without running into anything or knocking anything off. At that moment he realized that he could be mobile on his own with Maddy. Over time Lion Jim became much more independent. He had been a pilot before he lost his sight. Lion Jim again flew an airplane using a flight instructor as his eyes. Lion Jim showed the video at our state convention.

Lion Jim with illustrator Barbara Ann Fitzgerald "helped" Maddy write a children's book of Maddy's life, from leaving mom, going to a puppy raiser family, going into training, meeting Jim and going through training together, and living with Jim and his family. They call the book "The Lion Hearted Puppy, A Guide Dog's Journey". The book is easy to read and teaches children (and Lions) how a dog becomes a Leader Dog.

Indiana Lions and Lion Clubs not only contribute money to Leader Dog training. The district has three trustees on the Leader Dog Board. Some Lions are puppy raisers. Some Lion Clubs help with vet bills, etc.

I hope that the next time you see a Leader Dog you also will see how Lions helped to make it happen. There is much time, effort, training, and donations that help make teamwork of the Leader Dog and its partner look so natural and seemingly effortless.

I would like to thank the Lions of 25C and DG Tom Robbins for the opportunity to serve as your membership chair (GMT) for the new Lions year. DG Tom and I are here to work for you and help guarantee your success.

Many are probably expecting the same message that every new membership chair provides at this point in the year. I will, in part, oblige. Your club membership committee should be set by now. Club presidents and membership chairs will be contacted this month, sharing our resources, and providing new support for the improved recruiting of Lions.

However, that's where business as usual stops.

I am in this position to help you and your club succeed. I work for you. But we should have goals that we can all work towards. I am not here to tell you how to do it, or do it for you, but let's all start from the same page: we are here to succeed.

We are also asking for your club's commitment to achieve the Club Excellence Award (CEA) this year. Club Excellence is simply a blueprint for success. Let's have half of all 25C clubs earn this honor this year. Why not?

For ticket selling and scanning two shifts are available to work. The morning shift is 7:30 a.m.—3:00 p.m. The afternoon shift is 1:30 p.m.—9:00/9:30 p.m.

In return for working the Indiana Lions Foundation is offering W.P. Woods Fellowship credits for workers—one credit for the morning shift and two credits for the afternoon shift. It takes 10 credits to earn a W.P. Woods Fellowship.
