The Club Locator function —**Find a Club**—has been enhanced to work with the MyLion app to showcase the club's information, photos and upcoming projects to help attract new members. Donating to LCIF online has become easier!! They have added a button to the top of every page so all website visitors are aware of the opportunity to support our foundation and support the work of Lions around the globe. While the website may be getting a new look and feel, the good provided by Lions to the world remains the same. The goal of the new site is simple: to provide an excellent experience to Lions members.

Membership Date of Birth Change

To improve security when verifying the identity of a member, LCI is asking each new Lion for their complete birthdate - not just their birth year. You will no longer be able to complete new membership information on MyLCI without it. The birth dates for current members are showing as January 1 of their birth year. For a birth year of 1951, the birth date is 1/1/1951. Although LCI says that correcting the birth date is optional for existing members, the MyLCI webpage is not behaving. So it will be necessary to update this information for all Lion club members. This might be an excellent time to make sure the club secretary has all the correct information. Has anyone moved, changed phone numbers or email addresses? Secretaries, This is bit more work, but before the next club meeting, please print out the "Member Information Update Report" located under "Available Reports" or do a "Data Down- load". Take this report to the meeting and ask members to verify their information. If you need help with these reports, please contact your District Leadership — Zone Chairs are a good place to start.

Zionsville Lions Club raises \$2000.00 for Campaign 100 – Diabetes Awareness at its annual "*Dish and Donation*" Dinner on December 12.

For several years the Zionsville Club has celebrated the Christmas Holidays with its annual "Dish and Donation Dinner" for charity. Each year an individual charity is selected to receive the benefits from this event. Each member comes, brings a dish to pass, and donates the amount they would pay to take their family to a restaurant for an evening. The club provides the main dishes and entertainment. This year Campaign 100 – Diabetes Awareness was chosen to benefit from this event. Obviously a lot of Lions donated more than one dinner.

The club has been very active with the Diabetes Initiative and has sponsored a community meeting to highlight Diabetes Awareness, completed a Strides Walk in Lions Park to promote Diabetes Awareness and is planning a 5k Run Walk for Diabetes on February 16 in Zionsville. You may ask why you would do a Run/Walk in February. High School Track begins in March and many Hoosiers begin preparing for the Mini Marathon – they want to do practice runs/walks. Lion Mike Cole is assisting with the planning of this event and Lion Dr. Mel Prince is the Chairperson.

Speaking of Dr. Prince, he was recently appointed by Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) as <u>the</u> USA consultant for the Diabetes Awareness Program. He is lending his expertise to LCIF in reviewing grants being submitted for Diabetes programs throughout the United States.

This is an example of a fundraiser every club in District C could do sometime during 2019 to benefit Campaign 100 and make District C, the first District in the State to have 100% club participation. Currently 25% of our clubs have made donations to LCIF for the 2018-2019 Lions Year.

Remember also, only 6% of Lions make individual contributions to LCIF each year. Donations can be sent directly to LCIF or via <u>www.lionsclub.org</u> (click on donate). The minimum donation that can be made on line is \$11.00. You will need your membership number to complete this process. Your club secretary can provide you with this number or you can e-mail me at <u>kadica@tds.net</u> and I will be happy to send it to you.
