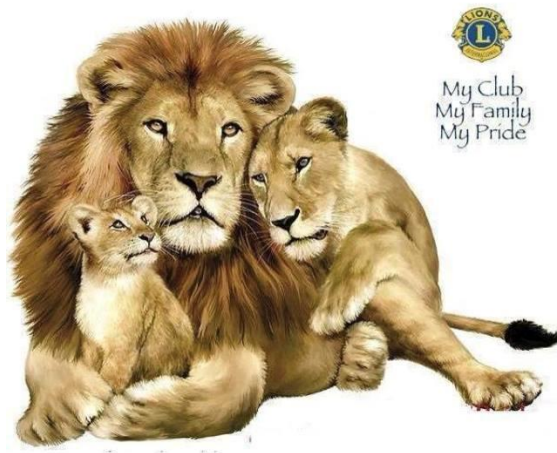


Together We Serve

Your district coordinator, MD coordinator and area coordinator are willing to provide this option.

Today, 253M people are blind or visually impaired; **Every day** 245 people die from measles; **Today** 2/3 of children report bullying; **by 2040**, 650M people are expected to be living with diabetes; **Each Night** more than 800M people go to bed hungry; **Every two minutes** a child is diagnosed with cancer, **by 2020** half the world’s population will be living in water stressed areas.

Just in case you didn’t know – last year (July 1, 2018 thru June 30, 2019) our district contributed over \$32,000 to Lions Clubs International Foundation. 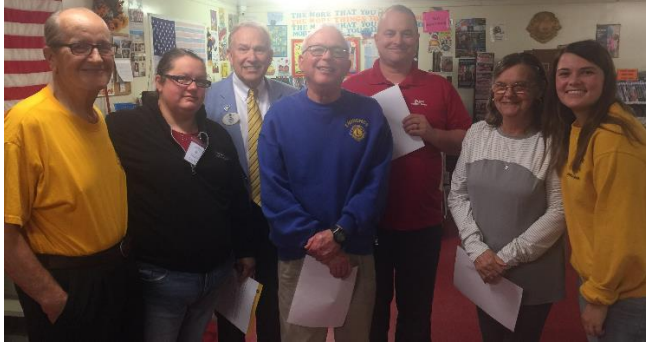

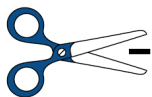

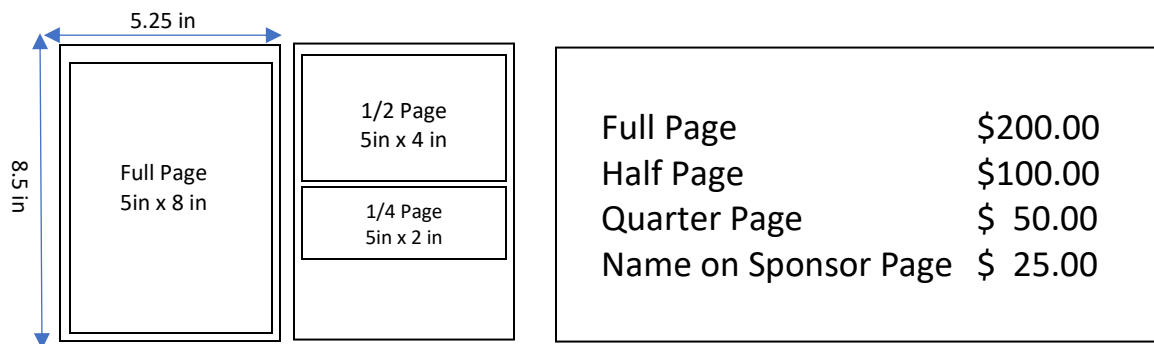
