Recently the Jamestown Community Lions Club purchased eight AED (Automated External Defibrillator) units for the eight churches in the Jamestown area. An AED unit is a portable electronic device that automatically diagnoses the life-threatening cardiac arrhythmias of ventricular fibrillation and pulseless ventricular tachycardia and is able to treat them through defibrillation, the application of electricity which stops the arrhythmia, allowing the heart to reestablish effective rhythm.

The donation of the AED units included 4 hours of training for 2 members from each of the receiving churches, which was provided by Indy CPR Pro out of Fishers, IN. The training included adult, child, and infant CPR training and adult and child AED training. Trainees are certified in Heart Saver and AED use. 12 members of eight churches were recently trained. Area churches receiving the AED units include: Jamestown Christian Church, United Methodist Church, Church of Prophecy, Harvest Time Church, New Hope Church, Old Union Church, Trinity Church, and WAM Church.

The purchase of the AED units and training will make the Jamestown area safer and provide a better quality of life for the citizens of Jamestown.

Zionsville Lions Club welcomed some new members at their Little League meeting.


