It may be cold outside but there is some hot news from the membership world!

The New Lion Joining Fees and Charter Member Fee of \$35 has been waived until June 30, 2021! What does this mean? Membership is now on sale!



We are one of the top retention districts in the world. No one does it better. However, our real problem is a lack of offense. To put it in basketball terms, we play the best defense in the country, but we have to score points on the other end of the court to win. At this point in the year, we have recruited about 300 new members statewide. That's great! However, this is only about one-fifth of what we historically need to grow. We have to recruit.








Brazil Lions Club conducted their first meeting of the year by Zoom!! PID Linda Tincher inducted a new member Sarah Froderman.


