103rd Annual Convention

Virtual LCICon 2021



Due to the continuing concerns about the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, the Lions Clubs International Board of Directors voted to transition the 2021 Montreal Lions Clubs International Convention to a virtual event that will be delivered totally online. This decision was made with the health and safety of our Lions, staff and vendors in mind by limiting international travel and large gatherings. These measures are key to global containment strategies.

- The registration fee is US\$75 beginning April 1.
- The registration fee for Leos will be US\$30 regardless of date.
- The Convention is currently scheduled for June 25-29.
- Additional event and registration details will be provided soon.

2021 Law Camp

Law camps give students entering the 6th, 7th and 8th grades a behind the scenes look at the criminal justice system. The four-day co-ed camps that are held at University campuses offer a more advanced look at law enforcement through field trips, exciting demonstrations and motivating programs. Campers stay on campus with the Troopers that are running the camp. There are physical activities that take place during the week along with hands on programs. Campers meet peers from around the state, participate in recreational activities and leave with a greater understanding of the police field.

Law Camp 2021. Due to the Pandemic and the stress it has put on our Clubs and parents, the Law Camp Committee is offering scholarships to those kids that would like to attend Law Camp either in Anderson or Columbus. Anderson University Camp will be June 20th -23rd and Columbus Youth Camp is June 23rd -26th. Ages for Law Campers is 6th, 7th and 8th graders (and that includes going into 6th and coming out of 8th grades). The registration fee is \$150 and we are offering to pay \$130 and have the parent pay \$20. Of course, if that is a hardship that could be waived. <u>GST – not only includes helping clubs find activities to do but helping clubs with reporting.</u>

Just as so many other things have changed due to the pandemic, Service has too. Activities we once took for granted – ARE SERVICE. Today's services might just be small acts of kindness, that prior to the pandemic we would never have considered reporting such as picking up someone's newspaper or mail and walking it to their door; or on trash day wheeling the neighbor's container back to the garage, but that is a service. Checking on a homebound neighbor by phone is also a service.

Prior to the pandemic, 25C was 100% in reporting membership and was well on their way to 100% reporting of activities. Then everything stopped. As clubs return, they are finding many of the traditional service projects still cannot be done. Leaving them wondering what to do and often saying they have nothing to report – when really, they do. Lions need to recognize these new ways to provide service -- then report them.

I honestly believe we will be able to return to traditional service activities but until then Kindness Matters and small acts of kindness should be recognized by service and reported on MYLION. IN fact, that is one reason the report has a box for OTHER! This is difficult for some club secretaries who have even had difficult reporting traditional activities because they dislike using the computer. IF this is the case in your club, have the secretary or president appoint a club administrator. The secretary still takes the minutes, but this individual does the reporting. As the District Administrator, I will be happy to work with them to help them get started. Sharing the work, just like partnering with another club for a service project, makes the work easier to do.

I have compiled a list of service activities and a few fundraisers with the help of other GSTs. Just give me a call if you need some help finding something your club can do while we are still restricted in so many ways. Some activities on the list are simple and easy to do while others are more difficult.

I have no doubt, we will and in some cases already are doing vision screening and traditional types of service, but IF you are doing any of these OTHER types of services, be sure to let your club secretary know, especially if your club has not yet been able to meet. Reports can still be filed if the information is provided.

Lions Clubs International advises the sign of a healthy district is a District that Reports Service. With your help 25C can once again get back to being a healthy district that has a 100% record of filing both Membership reports and Activity Reports.




