Helping Lions Serve

Our focus this year is to Help Lions Serve. To be Engaged, Productive, and feel Fulfilled. This month we are focusing on being engaged.

I found I needed to call several Lions while working on my district directory. I took this opportunity to tell them about our vision for this year and ask what was happening in their club. The result increased interest in our cabinet meeting's information sessions on vision screening training, the new Blinq camera for pre-school vision screening, organ donations and eye surgery patient assistance program. I also found a Lion interested in starting a caregiver support group on Zoom. Email me if you are interested in that group or the diabetes share and support group on Zoom.

I have been able to visit several Lions Clubs at their events. From a biscuit and gravy breakfast, tenderloin sandwich sales, a full concession stand with hot dogs, burgers and tenderloins, a 3 on 3 basketball tournament, soft serve custard stand, and strong man try to ring the bell. At each place, I helped if needed and interacted with many Lions talking about their club, the club's plans, and problems. We also discussed the opportunities to be more engaged, productive and feel more fulfilled.

I walked around the county fair and visited with other groups, such as the Health Clinic serving four of our towns. I told them that Lions do vision screening at many daycares. They said that they have preschool children not in daycare. They are interested in Lions doing vision screening for those children at the health clinic. Their nursing students would get some clinical experience by vision screening with us on the new Blinq system. We talked about several other vision resources that Lions can provide or refer to others.

Now I will follow up, that is another important part of engagement, not dropping the ball.

Our district (cabinet) meeting will be in Mooresville. Our Lions Club meeting room is available, but the attached kitchen is not, and the area to walk to the restrooms has another meeting going on. But a few blocks away is IVY TECH with its new Zoom wired classrooms. The Mooresville Lions Club President, Treg Hopkins, is head of community involvement at IVY TECH. We have a zoom meeting room with excellent bandwidth there. Treg is knowledgeable about the system, and so we will get expert support. Hybrid classes will start the week after our meeting, so we will be one of the first to use the virtual meeting system.

We really want in-person attendance. We need a quorum to pass the budget and other matters. You can get hands-on training only in person. The Zoom invitation with the link to join will be sent in a separate email to all club secretaries for use by those who cannot come to Mooresville. Publishing the link in this newsletter that is available on the web would not be prudent. "I'm not going to do it."

Be engaged. We will see you at the Cabinet meeting, on Banner Night, and in my wanderings throughout the district.

New Treasurer for Indiana Lions for ISBVI

When Clubs or Cabinet Treasurers are writing checks to the State Project, please have them make sure checks are made out to "Indiana Lions for the ISBVI" so we will not have a problem depositing them.

Note: Please note that all donations should be sent first to the District Secretary, who documents the club's name, amount and project donated to before sending it to the District Treasurer. Any donations sent directly to any project will not be listed in the treasurer's reports at the district level. Only donations made through District C can be listed by our treasurer in any district reports.

More than one state project has told us that they are having problems depositing checks that do not match the name(s) on the project's account. When sending checks directly Individuals and clubs are asked to properly name the project on their check.

District C Lions: It is not necessary to write separate checks to each project. Most of you may continue as you have in the past, i.e., write one check with an enclosed note directing the amounts to go to different projects. District Treasurer will send money to projects as clubs indicate on the memo page.

Indiana Lions MD25 Membership and Marketing Initiative 2021

The Indiana State Chairs for Membership and PR/Marketing have re-applied for a combined \$20,000 in funding under the LCI Departmental Grant programs. This grant proposal was approved in FY2020, but was not funded.

These funds will be used to create and implement "Project On-Lion". It will provide an integrated web presence for 70 clubs in the State, along with a standard system for all club officers, PIDs, PDGs and Committee Chairs. It will enable Indiana Lions to communicate both internally and to the public better than ever before.

Indiana adopted the popular Google Workspace suite of products as our State IT standard in 2019. Using this package, all Indiana club officers will have standardized access for the first time. Additional accounts will be provided to PIDs, PDGs, State Committee Chairs, State office, etc.

The seventy pilot websites (ten per district) will be built from pre-fabricated secure website architecture to save time and reduce costs. The sites may contain club news, calendars for upcoming events, a photo and video highlight section, online stores for tickets and fundraising items, an online membership application, online payment processing, and more. They will be designed to automatically link photos to Instagram and Facebook accounts to improve public and media reach. Other automated links are being explored, such as venmo, twitter, and stripe.

Using Workspace, linking the sites through Google Analytics and Google Trends will also help us drive viewers and prospective members to Lions sites and programs. State and District Lions news will also be able to be posted across these platforms. The eventual goal is to provide all participating Lions Clubs with this standard set of online administrative tools.

This is not a pure advertising campaign, or a pure membership sales effort, but a team effort to build a collaborative communication platform that will be lasting and effective. The public's engagement and buying decisions are increasingly made by the selection of online offerings. Indiana Lions are choosing to be seen as an engaged, effective, active group; open to new people, and willing to grow.


Funds will be used to help secure licenses and personnel to create these sites and accounts, along with six to twelve months of initial automated postings, secure payment processing and other standard expenses. All disbursements will be made by our State Controller, within the Objects and Ethics of the Association, and compliant with all grant guidelines.


