Google Workspace Now Operational for Indiana Lions!

Our Google Workspace system for Indiana Lions clubs and leadership is now operational! This commercial family of products provides all 356 Indiana clubs and Indiana Lions officers with a standard set of online tools.

Workspace includes Gmail, online chat, club management tools, record-keeping, cloud storage, teleconferencing, and much more. This \$275,000 annual value has been provided at no charge to our Association, clubs or officers through an offer from Google for Nonprofits.

Club, district and state officers will be receiving an activation email from inlions.org. This will contain step-by-step activation instructions for all presidents, secretaries, treasurers, membership chairs, and marketing/communications chairs. PIDs and PDGs also have a free account.

Our system is set up by office, not person, like pres.acme@inlions.org, sec.acme@inlions.org, treas.acme@inlions.org. By naming these accounts in this manner, future directories and access to our leadership will be made much simpler. Incoming officers will not have to set up their own renamed personal accounts on whatever system they choose, and training will be greatly simplified.

Officers above club level all have designated accounts by office too, like zone chairs at zone1A.25A@inlions.org, VDGs and District Governors at dg.25B@inlions.org, and State Office at state.sec@inlions.org, and controller.md25@inlions.org. GAT team members and major state committee chairs are usually identified as gmt.25g@inlions.org, vision.25F@inlions.org, mcc.md25@inlions.org, etc

If you hold an office, be on the lookout for the activation email with the step-by-step instructions. Start using these accounts as soon as you can. It will only take about five minutes for you to start using the new Workspace account. Try out the chat feature, Google Meet for video conferencing, or just send a few emails on your new inlions.org Gmail account.

This the largest installation of any combined software system for Lions in the US this year. It will provide us a durable administrative support platform for many years to come and save thousands of our dues dollars to boot.

Indiana Lions Foundation Indiana State Fair Project Information



The 2022 Indiana State Fair begins July 29th and runs through August 21st. As last year, the Fair will be closed on Mondays and Tuesdays. State Fair management has decided to close gate 18, so we will have only gates, 12 and 1W this year, but we have added a new position of "stamper" at each gate.

The website is available for you to sign up. To register, please visit the State Fair signup page on the Indiana Lions Foundation website at IndianaLionsFoundationMD25.org.

If you did not work last year, there are several changes that include our new parking situation. You may now enter gate 10 (northeast corner of the fairgrounds) and park as close to the large white maintenance building as possible. You will find our check-in booth on the west side of the maintenance

building in one of five small buildings. Our banner will hang above our booth. The bank is located in that same group of buildings, so we will not have to go upstairs to get money.

There are four shifts available this year. The start time listed for each shift is the time you are expected to check in at our booth. These times have changed from previous years.

- 5:30 am—8:30 am Volunteers on this shift will earn 1 W.P. Woods credit.
- 8:00 am—2:30 pm Volunteers on this shift will earn 1 W.P. Woods credit.
- 2:00 pm—8:30 pm Volunteers on this shift will earn 2 W.P. Woods credits.
- 4:00 pm—8:30 pm Volunteers on this shift will earn 1 W.P. Woods credit.

We have more than 800 shifts to fill and would appreciate all the help you can give the Foundation.

Here are descriptions of the positions so you will know what to expect.

Seller: This position is inside the air conditioned buildings and is selling tickets.

Monitor: Watches over the automated ticket machines and helps people use the machine when needed and directs their attention to those machines if they want to use credit cards. The monitor will check out money from the bank and keep it in the sellers building. On rare occasions the monitor might be asked to sell tickets from outside. This does not happen very often. This position is outside, but the Fair promised we would have shade this year.

Scanner: Works outside under a tent with several large fans to help keep it cool. As customers present tickets the scanner needs to use the hand-held machines to verify the tickets.

Stamper: The stamper is positioned at the exit and stamps the hands of those wishing to be re-admitted to the fair. This is a sitting outside position. The Fair assured me there would be shade.
