

A Message from GST Cindy Russell

Don't hang your Secretary or Club Administrator out to dry.

Make sure you are reporting your service hours to them so they can report the hours to LCI. If you are having trouble deciding what constitutes a reportable activity, just ask someone.

Service Reporting

To effectively tell our story, measure our impact and grow membership, it's critical that all clubs report service. Every project we participate in as Lions and Leos, no matter how big or small, is valuable in our journey of serving our communities and the world.

What is not reportable service? Many Lions and Leos serve their communities individually, outside of the activities planned by their clubs, districts, or multiple districts. Some examples include bringing a meal to a neighbor, driving a parent to a medical appointment, or volunteering at their place of worship. This type of work is important and commendable; however, it should not be reported as a Lions' service activity.

Metrics that are currently collected by Lions International include: • Number of activities: Each activity reported by a club, district or multiple district is counted as one activity. • Number of people served: These are the direct beneficiaries of Lions service. Sometimes the number of people served can be counted precisely, and sometimes it must be estimated. • Number of volunteers: The number of people who participate in the planning or implementation of a service project. As Lions often invite friends to join their service activities, the number of volunteers can include both Lions and non-Lions. • Number of volunteer hours: The number of hours spent planning and implementing a service project. • Funds raised: The amount of money collected to fund service activities or charitable donations. This can be from Lions making personal contributions, or funds raised from non-Lions during a fundraising event. • Funds donated: The amount of charitable funds given to an individual or organization. Funds donated to LCIF are tracked by the foundation and need not be reported as a service activity, but if an event was held to raise those funds, that event can be reported as a fundraising activity.

Let's try to get District C to 100% reporting. Remember, if your secretary and/or president does not have internet access, your club can appoint a Club Administrator who can file your reports. I had one club secretary tell me that her granddaughter helps her file their reports. That works too.

Dear Lion,

Please remember that all Lions clubs, districts and multiple districts with annual gross receipts less than US\$50,000 that are not required to file Forms 990 or 990-EZ must file the e-Postcard (also known as the 990-N). If your Lions club, district or multiple district has a foundation, which is a separate legal entity, the appropriate form will need to be filed as well.

December 15^{th,} 2022 is the postmark deadline for the Council Chair Person to send one winning entry to the Brand & Creative Department Headquarters.
