

A Different Kind of Service – Showing Appreciation

I am aware our focus has been and will continue to be toward reportable service activities since those service hours allow LCI to show the impact we are making. They are the proof that we are the largest service club organization in the world.

However, an often-overlooked aspect of service is acknowledging the time and effort put forward for an activity. Do your Lions members feel appreciated? How about your community partners? And don't forget the non-lion helpers.

How about your club? Does your club feel appreciated by the district? Is there any need that the district can meet or help you meet? The district does not want any club to feel like they are not important, or that they are "too small" to matter. Every single Lion, every single Club, and every District is important. We make up Lions Clubs International.

This is what I experienced a couple of years ago.

I am a member of the Lebanon Lions Club. We hold an annual Hoagie sale as our primary fundraiser on the first Friday of June of which I am the chair. This particular year we had a couple of members who did not think they really contributed much to the process, so I decided to acknowledge their contribution. Two of the members were not physically able to stand for any length of time so they sat at the end of the counter and opened all the bun bags. That was about 100 twist ties to undo.

I got the bright idea to take some of the twist ties and make an abstract art piece and frame it in a small 2" x 3" picture frame. I presented these at our next meeting, and you would have thought I handed them gold. I was taken aback by their responses.

It just happened that about 6 months later, one of the members, he was our oldest member, did not survive an illness. You may or may not have guessed, but at his funeral, on the table closest to the casket stood that little 2x3 picture frame. I could not believe it. He was so proud of that little gag gift that his family included it. I still shake my head every time I think about it.

Such is the power of a small token of appreciation. He, like every other Lion, did not serve to be recognized, he served because there was a need, but that little token let him know that he was important and appreciated.

This past few years since Covid have taken a toll on everyone. I think it would go a long way to take a few extra moments or a few extra steps to encourage each other, to recognize that serving might be a little tougher now than it has been in the past, that members might be a little more tired or stressed than usual, or that extra help is hard to come by and members are having to shoulder more of the burden. Let us strengthen and encourage each other.

A Message from Cancer Control Project

Cancer Control Project Expanding to Address Childhood Cancer



For more than 75 years, Indiana Lions have supported cancer treatment, research, and education through our partnership between the Lions Cancer Control Fund of Indiana, Inc. and the Department of Radiation Oncology at the Indiana University Medical Center campus in Indianapolis. The department serves cancer patients of all ages, but the vast majority of the patients are adults.

In order to better serve pediatric cancer patients in Indiana, the Board of Trustees of the Lions Cancer Control Fund of Indiana, Inc. has voted unanimously to establish a partnership with the pediatric

oncology programs at Riley Hospital for Children. We will kick off this partnership with a \$25,000 commitment to support ongoing research by Dr. Jennifer Belsky and her team at Riley to address severe neuropathy experienced by more than 50 percent of the children undergoing chemotherapy.



We look forward to this new partnership with Riley Hospital for Children, even as we continue our longstanding relationship with the Department of Radiation Oncology.

A Message from Indiana Disaster Assistance Committee

Lions of Indiana are a part of a disaster relief network of volunteer organizations in Indiana. The purpose of this network is to coordinate disaster relief efforts and avoid duplication. Through that network earlier today, I learned in my role as chairman of our Lions of Indiana Disaster Assistance Committee that the Morgan County Emergency Management Agency is requesting relief supplies such as roof tarps for damaged homes. The exact location was not specified. I also learned that there may be needs in Owen County but received no specifics. I am sending this request to club secretaries in Owen and Morgan counties to 1) determine from clubs more precisely what the needs may be, 2) to determine how many people have been impacted by these recent storms and 3) to determine if our District Governor should submit an LCIF disaster assistance grant request for District C. LCIF disaster assistance grants are available only if more than 100 people have been impacted across the district.
