Secretaries should know the importance of filing these reports, and Presidents should know the importance of being a backup for the Secretary in the case that they are unable to do it. This is also an emphasis of International, in that they have instituted a new position of Global Service Team, in addition to the already existing Global Leadership and Global Membership Team. Please know that you don't have to wait until the last day of the month to file your reports. You can file after your first meeting, and then update or add services as they happen.

I look forward to visiting with each club at the official DG visits that will be scheduled, but please let me know of special programs you have going on so that if I'm in the area, I can make it a point to stop by. 
