

Brian's Trike Race - to better align this event with the school's calendar and allow students/faculty to participate more fully, the new event date is APRIL 22 2018.

School Workday - the next Lions schools workday will be held in spring 2018 - date to be determined

Anthem Volunteer workday - October 21 (9 am - noon) - Thanks to the Speedway Lions Club as sponsor of the workday, 85 Anthem Volunteers were on campus working alongside Speedway Lions and Lions for ISBVI volunteers to renovate house 120 on campus (painting the exterior, completing some landscaping and some interior painting), as well as do landscaping and mulching around the school's ground. The Anthem Foundation provided up to \$1,500 to support the workday. Several PU sorority students also assisted.

Indiana School for the Blind and Visually Impaired (ISBVI) is nationally and internationally recognized for its excellence and best practices in educating children and young adults who are blind or have low vision and is a critical resource for students, teachers, parents and caregivers. Every year, they educate hundreds of children/ young adults ranging from 3 to 22years old living in all parts of Indiana, many of whom, due to severe or multiple disabilities, other schools in the state cannot serve.

Wow, great job by the Cloverdale Scout Troop in sponsoring an Eagle Scout project to raise funds for a Smart Board for the Indianapolis School for the Blind & Visually Impaired! As you saw, because of the close support relationships between these scouts and the Cloverdale Lions Club, funds were donated by the Cloverdale Lions to our ISBVI State Project for pass-through to the school.

You may not know it, but the relationship between Lions Clubs International and Scouting organizations dates back to the early 1900s. It was our first national service project! Since then, this collaboration has provided meaningful benefits to the communities we both serve. So how can such a relationship benefit your club.....
young people who volunteer mature into adults who SERVE and are potential Lions!

Why not encourage your own club to work with local troops and partner with local scouts as mentors to help your young people achieve their full potential through community engagement. When scouts participate in the planning and implementation of Lions-sponsored service projects, they contribute a unique perspective and energy to addressing local issues. And when Lions and scouts combine their expertise, resources and dedication to improving the lives of others, they can make a real difference in the community!

If your club can't sponsor a troop at this time, why not find out what local scouts are doing? Encourage them in the philosophy and habit of service to the community. Through our **Lions Young Leaders in Service Awards**, you can recognize their efforts with an acknowledgement from your club and Lions Clubs International that can be used for college and job applications. Granting such awards also increases visibility of Lions Clubs, its various youth programs, and what you are doing to help youth. Other benefits to your club include opportunities to share your love for service, build community relationships, engage young people, and invite youth to partner on hands-on projects.

Why not invite local schools, scout troops and other youth groups, to log service hours over a twelve month period? How about a goal of completing either 50 or 100 hours of service to your community? Recognize these future potential Lions with Lions Young Leaders in Service Certificates and Lions Young Leaders in Service Pins – both available on our LCI website (<http://members.lionsclubs.org/EN/serve/other-ways-to-serve/youth/young-leaders-service-award.php>). These awards can be incorporated into any existing award programs your club currently offers, or perhaps your Lions club can host a special recognition event or luncheon for award recipients or possibly present them at school or troop awards events.

Such youth awards will give your club opportunity to include information about your Lions club, the mission of Lions, and the community service work we all do. In addition, invite award recipients and participating schools to engage in other Lions Clubs youth programs sponsored by your club or district.

And remember, Scoutmasters, Assistant Scoutmasters and scout parents make terrific Lions....add them to your mailing and email lists. Let them know what you do and how they can partner with and join your club to help others.

Happy New Year Lions! It's been a very busy vision year for screening and support of our neighbors with vision issues. Here are some highlights from what has been happening recently:

- The Fall Vision Screening season has wrapped up, with a few schools yet to do in the first quarter of 2018. Our data is not complete yet, but it looks like **ANOTHER RECORD YEAR by all the clubs and teams involved**. If your club or team has screening data not yet reported to PDG Charles Roth, please do so now. We want you to get the credit to which your club is due!
- We are happy to announce the addition of two new doctors to our Indiana Lions Vision Services medical advisory panel!
- **Dr. Kathryn Haider** is professor of pediatric ophthalmology at the Indiana University Medical School. She is a graduate of the University of Wisconsin Medical School, and served her residency in St. Louis before joining the faculty. She also practices at IU North in Carmel and at the Roudebush VA hospital in Indianapolis. Dr. Haider brings specific expertise in ophthalmology of special needs children and other visually handicapped populations.
- Also joining our advisory panel is **PID Dr. Hauser Weiler**, who is vice-chair of Lions Kidsight USA Foundation and a practicing Ophthalmologist in Virginia. Dr. Weiler retired from the US Navy Medical Corps as a full Captain in 1989. He brings tremendous experience to us in vision screening and a full Lions relationship with KidSight USA.
- With the approval of DG Chloe, additional card sets were purchased last fall to help new clubs expand screening efforts. **We now have plenty of equipment** for your club to do screenings: call or email for more information.
- **Oxford and Wolcott Lions** are now screening their local schools! Congratulations on a great training and the screening Benton and Tri-County schools.
- **Monon Lions** successfully screened the North White School Corporation with new record numbers. Good job Lions George Wood, Steve Annis, and all the Monon Lions.
- **Think about asking your school nurses and health professionals to join your club**. They are great people and perfect Lions! When your club partners with your local schools, SCHOOLS AND CLUBS WIN. More service= More money= More LIONS!!
