









## LCIF News

LCIF is starting a new program similar to Sight First 1 & 2 called Campaign 100 LCIF - Empowering Service. This campaign will raise 300 Million dollars over 3 years to support not just sight, but vision, hunger, environment, diabetes and childhood cancer. (Youth is not a separate category as youth are considered to be a part of all categories). PIP Joe Preston and ID Jenny Ware are over Campaign 100 LCIF for Constitutional Area 1. Michigan's PID Esther LaMothe is LCIF Area Chair over MI, IN, KY, and IL and I am the Vice Area Chair. This picture (top left) was taken during two days of training at Oak Brook, IL.

LCI Forward will explain how Lions can best assist with Diabetes at the 101st LCI Convention in Las Vegas. It is believed they will share ideas in the form of education and prevention techniques. The focus of childhood cancers will be aimed at providing assistance to families living with the ordeal of their child: possibly providing transportation, places to stay, or providing comfort etc. as medically we can't do anything.

What we can do now is try and get every club to make a donation and to encourage all Lions to either pledge a contribution over the next 3 years or make a one time contribution to LCIF. Many clubs give, but only 6% of individual Lions contribute. We can make a difference. As soon as more information is available, I will pass it on.


## PID Linda Tincher, Vice Area Chair, IL IN KY MI
