DG Chloe's Notes:

Thanks once again to the Secretaries and/or Presidents who filed their MMR and SAR reports. Your help, camaraderie and cooperation is always very much appreciated. *Although MMR reporting will stay the same for next year, SAR reporting will take a different form. The form this will take has not been fully put out by LCI, but is discussed in the Officer Training classes that have been schedule for May. Please, Presidents and Secretaries, make it a point to visit one of the remaining training sessions listed on Page 4 of the Current News section of the newsletter.*

As you can see, the newsletter this month is divided into 2 parts, one for "Current News" and one for "Club News". The reason for this is two-fold: there are too many pages to all fit in one and be able to email or post to the district or state websites, and a comment was passed on to me that people want to see more current news than "old" news. However, I see a definite need for both. Viewing what other clubs have done can give a newer club ideas they might not have thought of.

One of the major changes that will affect individual members and clubs has to do with LCI's billing on membership listed on the LCI website as of July 1st and January 1st of each year. In the past, LCI would give a grace period where they would waive fees for those people dropped within the first 20 days of the new year. This was actually not part of the Constitution and ByLaws, but had been a practice. That is no longer the case. They are going back to where, as of July 1st or January 1st (i.e., June 30 and December 30th at midnight) they will be billing 6 months dues on anyone that is on your roster. The only exception will be for a death. As soon as you put in that a member is deceased, your account will receive a prorated credit.

You ask, "How does this affect me as a regular member since I am not a Secretary or Treasurer?" This is where you can be of great help to your club and district. You can pay your dues for the first half of the year before June 30th, so that you will not run the risk of being dropped from your clubs roster. That way, the club will know that you fully intend to continue on as a Lion. The Club Excellence Award (a description of which can be found on page 11 of the Current News section) depends on your club maintaining a "Membership Maintained" or "Net Growth" status as of midnight June 30th. If you have not paid your dues and the club has to drop you and they end with a minus growth, the club will not qualify for the Club Excellence Award. So to be sure all clubs can have the opportunity to earn the award, we need everyone working to maintain or increase membership.

As of right now, membership is down 74 in District 25C. We lost 2 clubs in Terre Haute, and there are 6 clubs that are down 4 or more, and we had 25 deceased members over the year so far. Dr. Aggarwal, our International President, challenged the leadership of the Indiana Lions to make his year a +1, although he would like to see us at the 1.5 million members worldwide. It would help if every club in District 25C was a +1, but I know that will be very hard to accomplish. Do your best to make sure your dues are paid, and if you know someone who is on the fence about staying in, find out why and help them to realize you are part of the world's largest (and best, I think) service organization, and there is a place for them in it. Do your best to help make your club a +1.

Last, but definitely not least, there is information on page 12 of the Current News portion about a new relationship with VisionWorks locations for eye glasses and eye exams. As you may (or may not) have heard, the relationship we had with LensCrafters is no longer in place. They will honor existing coupons, but will not be issuing any more. This will be a welcome addition with a fixed fee.

Thank you so much for your membership and service to the District and State.

As I view the blossoms of spring, Lions begin another season of fundraising and giving.



<u>Membership Satisfaction</u> -- How do you keep your members happy and coming back?

You need to ensure that your Lions club remains healthy and vital. Find out what the experience and expectations of belonging to your club is for your members. If you went to a restaurant and it did not meet your expectations, would you go back? The same goes for a Lions club!

Along with welcoming your new members, it is important to make sure they begin participating in club activities right away. If your club members feel welcome, comfortable and are involved in community service, they will remain part of your club for a long time.

There are many reasons for people to join a Lions Cub - the most common are:

- To serve their community
- To be involved with a specific service or cause
- To be with friends
- To become a leader in the community
- To be with other family members who are Lions

So how can your club provide the experiences your members are seeking?

Keeping your club efficient, productive and meaningful to your members results in many benefits:

- A club that is vital and a respected part of your community.
- The ability to provide service locally and globally.
- The ability to offer personal and professional growth opportunities
- A club that provides enjoyable fellowship.

Does your club feel unified, or is it just a collection of individual Lions?

Be sure your club has a club mission statement, objectives and defined goals. Communicate these to your members clearly and openly.

If a club is not thriving, it cannot serve.

The first step to ensuring your members have a positive experience is to know what they want from membership in your Lions club. Understanding what your members think about being a Lion will help you direct your efforts. Making changes based on your club members' needs and desires is the key to a good experience for them.

Losing members is an issue for many clubs, but the reasons why members leave are often the same. The five general issues former Lions cited most often as reasons for leaving are:

I. Unproductive meetings (not enjoyable, too hierarchal and formal, didn't like customs))

- II. Personal reasons
- III. Membership issues (not engaging newer members)
- IV. Club culture (egos, minds closed to new ideas)
- V. Service (lack of meaningful service)
