Training, Training and More Training!



"Training" was the word of the month for May, and that means meeting with the club officers from around the district to help train them and prepare them for the upcoming Lions' year which begins in just a little under a month from now. "Training" is the process by which someone is taught skills to complete a specific task to which they have been called and involves willingness and commitment to learn and to put into practice what has been taught.

One of my tasks this past year has been working with our club secretaries to help them improve on their monthly reports to Lions Clubs International. These reports have included the Monthly Membership Reports (MMR) and the Service Activity Reports (SAR).

In 2013-14, on average approximately 68% of our clubs filed their MMR each month. To date, this number has increased to over 94%, and in December, March, and April, 100% of the clubs filed their MMR. What is maybe more astounding is that District 25C has over 77% of our clubs having filed each and every month. This is commitment. This is TEAMWORK.

Fukuoka, Japan 2016

This design, selected by State Council to represent Indiana Lions at the 2016
International Convention in Fukuoka,
Japan, on June 24-28, was conceived by our very own 1st Vice District Governor Elect Ross Drapalik (Martinsville Noon Lions Club). **Great work Vice District Governor Elect Ross!**

The pin incorporates six elements representative of Japanese culture:

1) the **torii** (a traditional Japanese gate), 2) a **bonsai tree**, 3) a **Geisha** with her folding fan, 4) the **rising sun** in the background and represented on the Geisha's fan, 5) the **mountains of Japan**, and 6) the ocean and seas surrounding this island nation. A 7th element is the use of an oriental calligraphy font. And of course, being the Indiana pin, what else would we have on it, but an **Indianapolis 500 race car** – globally recognized icon of the USA and Indiana in particular. Notice that the car's number is **"25"** signifying that the Lions of Indiana are in Multiple District 25.

This pin will be for available after July 1 from your 2015-2016 District Governor, Dick McKellar, and 1st Vice District Governor, Ross Drapalik, when they visit your clubs.

Also, please encourage members of your clubs to start thinking about designs for our Indiana pin for the International Convention to be held in Chicago in 2017. Design criteria, submission dates, etc. will be sent out later this summer.





Foundation Update

• 51% of all clubs in the District have now made a donation to Lions Club International Foundation, which is slightly ahead of this time last year. Many clubs make their donations in June, so we anticipate most District 25C clubs will participate in this year's Lions Club International Foundation campaign and beat our \$10,000 donation goal for the year.

• The Hearing Lions received yet another \$10,000 International Assistance Grant, supplying over 300 hearing aids to needy residents in the Nayarit state of Mexico. Duane Wass (Bainbridge) and his team have now completed over ten years of international service, and were featured at the MidAmerica Conference on Hearing in Cincinnati OH. Indiana Lions Foundation now serves as the charitable conduit for outside donations to The Hearing Lions.

• Lions Club International Foundation has now sent over \$197,000 in relief of the two massive earthquakes that have rocked Nepal. The first \$100k was placed as a Major Catastrophe Grant and other funds have been sent to districts requesting \$10,000 Humanitarian Assistance Grants. Over 18,000 Lions are working in this effort. Very few, if any, other NGOs are able to bring this tremendous surge of manpower on such short notice, and couple it with the deep financial resources of a major global foundation.

Yours Truly will be stepping down as Lions Club International Foundation Coordinator after five busy years. This will allow me to dedicate efforts to our exploding School Vision Screening program, and my continuing role as District Leadership Chair (Global Leadership Team).

I have had the honor of assisting with four \$10,000 Humanitarian Assistance Grants (Battle Ground, Clinton's two grants and Oxford) and five International Assistance Grants for The Hearing Lions. This reflects \$90,000 in direct help to our communities and projects.

A Fiscal Year End report will be filed at the first cabinet meeting of the new year on August 15th. I would like to thank District Governor Roth and his team for another super year for 25C and Lions Club International Foundation's great partnership.
