
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

Spotlight Club—Earl Park

I have been a member of the Earl Park Lions Club for now over 29 years. Many changes over that time but the mission to help our community has been consistent.

Some activities have faded away or changed but several of the key projects are still in place. In the month of July our club sponsors a Summer Program for the Kids at our town park. 2 days a week children join to participate in organized activities to provide activity for those during the summer lay off from School. Those that meet the required number of days of attendance are rewarded with a day trip to a nearby Amusement Park or other fun event (Cubs Game one Year). Not only do the children benefit from these sessions but we also have young adults (Our Scholarship Recipients for one), who volunteer to help organize the activities for the children. Our club funds any materials need for the program as well as the day trip with a lunch and other cost associated with the trip.

Speaking of Scholarships, for somewhere between 35 and 40 years our club has given out scholarships to High School Seniors for use in their next level education. Lately the amount has been \$ 1000 per student with some years going to 4 or 5 recipients. Most amazing to me is that all of these Funds are generated from the sales of aluminum cans for recycle that our community drop off at our “Cans for College” can cage in the town. Not only do the cans generate the needed income but also our community is better for the recycling efforts of many keeping those cans out of landfills and off of road ditches in our rural community.

Another project that has continued for almost as long as the can collections is our annual Halloween Party. This was always held in our Town Park Shelter with food and snacks provided by our club as well as monetary awards for the costume contest. During the Covid year this was altered to a “Trunk of Treat Event” in the park and has remained that currently with our club still providing food and refreshments and a costume contest by also getting our community getting involved by bringing their decorated setups out of the trunks of their cars and handing out candy to visitors as they survey the interesting decorations and costumes.

Lastly another program that dates back as long as the two previous projects is our “Bingo Shelter” that we operate for 3 days annually on Labor Day weekend during the “Fall Festival” at our Town Park that brings out literally thousands of attendees to listen to Bluegrass Music, Tractor Pulls & Demo Derby (Also Sponsored by our Club), Flea Markets, and campers by the thousands in the designated campsite areas. Much of the income from the Bingo event helps fund the program mentioned above other than the scholarships funded totally from can sales.

Another project lately was renovation work on the Softball/Baseball diamond at the park. Not only have many parts of the field been updated but also the concession stand had a makeover and a few of our members have run food concessions for summer youth baseball events and such in the last few years.

A couple of the events that we did for many years but that has faded away recently are the “New Prospective Member Steak Fry” in the park where we grilled steaks in the park on a Mid-September evening inviting prospective new members. Another was the Santa visit to town at the Library or the Local Legion in the month of December.

So many of our original members have passed away that I remember having poured their hearts out in an effort to promote our club and most of all help our community. I often think about those previous members who helped also shape this member and motivate many other to donate their time to “Serve”. It’s more than a motto around Earl Park because the entire community has bought into this idea even before the inception of the Club.

“We Serve”!!
