Driving Directions to District Convention March 14th



Eye Glass Recycling Report PDG Tom Slattery

Eyeglass recycling is going along better than ever, thanks to the very generous of the Lions of District 25 F. The Lions of your District continue to be the leaders in the collection of used Eye wear, Keys for Cancer and used Hearing Aids for our Speech & Hearing project.

The keys for Cancer are collected and combined with the keys that we get at the quarterly Cancer Control meeting. We sell the keys & the money is turned over to the treasure of Cancer Control, Lion Paul Shane. Lions in District A & B also collect the keys in their area and that money is also turned in to Lion Paul. Over the year's we have added several thousand dollars to this fund.

The used hearing Aids that we get are turned over to PDGs Goldman & Winegardner of the Speech & Hearing Project.

Eye Glass Collection boxes. Since 2002 we have placed over three Hundred boxes in optical shops thru out central & southern Indiana. These boxes have been built by Lions and any cost to District F has been provided by the Eye glass recycling committee of District A (where I got started in this program.) PID Gene Rice has been the driving force in all of this combined effort to collect & distribute Glasses. District A was also a major contributer of money for the purchase of our recycling van. The recycling Van is the property of District F, as is the small trailer that we use for eyeglass collection. Both of these have been used by other Lions for parades, moving equipment for Lions fund raising and even a bell choir each summer for a church from Columbus, Indiana. The summer parade list is growing!

The recycling Van is a moving Lions bill board, It has been to our International Hq. To the Illinois Lions State Hq. to pick up glasses, 17,000, we have made two trips to Florida which resulted in 459, French fry boxes with 183,000 pr of glasses for our Recycling program. We get the French fry boxes that McDonalds discards, a good sturdy box that will hold 400 pr of raw glasses. We save \$1.45 each time we use one of these boxes. I can say that without this resource we could not provide the missions with the numbers of glasses that we have. Not only our District F mission but Church, Medical & student mission's as well. This whole program is a winner for all of us. WE ARE PAYING IT FORWARD.

NOTE!! We will add the names of MAJOR donors to this van, those individuals, District's & Lions Clubs that have given \$1,000.00 (Still time for you to get on!!!)

Our partnership with District A has been and continues to be a good one, Recycling and our District F Mission to Mexico have been a great success because of this partnership.

I wish I could mention the names of all the LEADERS thru out our District & in District's C & E who collect glasses each day, help me sort them & deliver them to the eyeglass center at Wanatah, IN (Dist A) I will mention my two grandsons who are a great help to me. Will 14 & Tom Garrard 10 These boy's have helped me so much that they need very little supervision doing the work with "The Glasses", I have been busy visiting Clubs and thanking them for all of the support we have received and I will continue doing this. If any of our Lions are member's of ANY, type group that does mission work and would like some glasses, just let me know.

Thanks for all you do for all of us!






