

# **Global Service Team (GST)**

Lions International has added the third part to the GLOBAL ACTION TEAM. Currently there are two parts to this world wide team. The Global Leadership Team (GLT) and Global Membership Team (GMT). The third part is the **Global Service Team (GST)**. The GST is a new tool that is being used to monitor and encourage clubs to track their membership and service activities. Every club secretary fills out the monthly club report each month. This gives the District, Multi-District, and International a better review of what Lions are doing in the World. As we all know the purpose of Lions is "WE SERVE". By having a better understanding of the club membership and service activities the District, Multi-District and International can use their resources to help support the projects. There is a place for the club secretary to fill out the number of service activity (projects) your club has completed or were working on that month. On the report it would read **Monthly Service Activity Report (SAR).** 

A lot of clubs work on multi projects at one time. Our club opens the club house monthly for the Boy Scouts and Cub Scouts to meet. This is a service project we turn in monthly because it took a Lion to open the building. One club collects canned foods at every meeting and donates it to an area food bank. This is a service project to their community. We would be surprised at the number of service projects and hours of service our clubs do each month which no one knows about because we don't send in our monthly reports. Every service project, no matter how big or small, is important to our communities in which we live. By making sure the service reports are reported monthly on the activities report, clubs can achieve the recognition and honor they deserve for serving their communities.

Lions International has targeted five areas of service worldwide. These areas are:

- 1 Diabetes
- 2 Childhood Cancer
- 3 Vision
- 4 Hunger
- 5 Environment

Using these five new service challenges can provide new opportunities for your club. Each one of these areas can become a new service project. There are future Lions in your community who are waiting for your club to start a service project in which they want to be involved. These projects will make your community aware of Lions and what you are doing in their community. If your club isn't doing any of these challenge projects, choose one and see the results in your community. When you do a major service project, take a picture of the event and call your area newspaper. They want area information about community events. If you don't have a newspaper, use Facebook or another media and tell your friends of your event. You will be surprised about the comments from your friends.

Lions International had a goal of 100 million people being served by the end of Lions year 2018. We have passed that number and doubled it! Each club will receive the recognition due to it for participating in a service project. If every club reports its service activities, how many more people would we show we have served?

#### NO MORE DUES CREDITS FOR DROPPED MEMBERS

Starting on June 30, 2018, dues credits for membership drops will <u>not</u> be issued *after* the release of the semi-annual billings on July 1 and January 1.

In the past, Lions Clubs International has given clubs a grace period in January and July to adjust their club rosters and receive a credit for unreported membership drops. This practice has been a courtesy extended to clubs by Lions International despite rules governing the practice in Board Policy. The board of directors recently decided that enforcement of existing policy is necessary in order to be in compliance with Board Policy.

Here are a few best practices that can help you prepare your club for their July dues billing:

- 1. Club officers need to update their membership rosters using MyLCI or their regional reporting system.
- 2. Club officers to submit their membership roster to MyLCI or their local reporting system **prior to June 30, 2018 CDT.**
- 3. **Inform** current and incoming club officers that membership dues credits will no longer be issued.




