Donations to LCIF, State Projects & State & District Committees

In order for your club to receive proper credit for supporting our Indiana Lions State Projects and State and District Committees it is **IMPORTANT** that the following procedures be followed when making donation payments.

Send **ALL** state project and committee donations to **District 25-G Cabinet Treasurer Lion Rose Russell, PO Box 31, Lakeville, IN 46536.**

Write one check payable to **District 25-G** for the combination of all state project and committee donations and include a list of the entities you are supporting with the dollar amount for each.

Example: CHECK IS WRITTEN FOR \$700

INCLUDED LIST FOR THE EXAMPLE MIGHT READ:

\$100 for School for the Blind	\$100 for Eye Bank
\$100 for Speech and Hearing	\$100 for Leader Dog
\$100 for Cancer Control	\$100 for IN Lions Foundation
\$50 for Law Camp	\$50 for Diabetes

Periodically she will mail checks to each of our 5 state projects, Indiana Lions Foundation and State Comptroller PDG Vernon Provines (for State Committee donations.) Her submissions will show the dollar amount your club is donating along with the name and address of the Lion in your club to receive acknowledgement. If you wish your club's donations to remain in the district for such committees as Diabetes, Leo Clubs or Law Camp please specify that with your submittal.

If these procedures are followed everything will be made easier for CT Lion Rose and the district will have a more accurate record of what clubs are giving to our state projects and state and district committees.

LCIF Donations: If a Lion or club is making a donation to LCIF it **should be sent directly to LCIF** with a form downloadable from www.lcif.org. Click on "Ways to Give" then "Melvin Jones Fellowship" (even if the recipient will be named later) and then "[MJF Application Form](#)." This will insure that LCIF has an accurate record of donations from individual Lions and clubs toward Melvin Jones Fellowships.

W. P. Woods and Richard T. Miyamoto Fellowships should be ordered directly from the Indiana Lions Foundation or Indiana Lions Speech and Hearing using the form available on their websites or from one of our trustees.

District Governor Vic Fisher has appointed Lion Kim Polk of the LaFontaine Lions Club to fill a vacancy on the Board of Trustees of the Indiana Lions Cancer Control Fund.. Lion Kim is the secretary of the La-Fontaine Lions Club and the wife of 2nd VDG Tom Polk.

Revised Suspension Policy

Have Your Club's Dues Been Paid?

The Board of Directors of Lions Clubs International amended the suspension policy that affects clubs that have not paid their LCI club balances in a timely manner. Beginning July 1, 2015, clubs will automatically be placed on Financial Suspension if balances beyond 90 days exceed US\$20/member or \$1,000, whichever is less, and cancellation will occur after the 28th of the month following suspension if full payment is not received. As a result of unpaid LCI dues, suspension will be reported in October and April following the July and January dues billings.

Suspension is the temporary deferment of the charter, rights, privileges and obligations of a Lions club due to an unpaid balance. Clubs on suspension shall not: (a) Conduct service activities (b) Conduct fund raising activities; (c) Participate in district and multiple district functions or seminars; (d) Participate in any voting procedures outside of the club (e) Endorse or nominate a candidate for district, multiple district or international office; (f) Submit Monthly Membership Reports and other reports; (g) Sponsor a Lions club, or organize a Leo or a Lioness club. Clubs on Suspension shall: (a) Hold meetings to discuss the future of the club and identify the steps needed to regain an active status; (b) Make payments to clear the existing outstanding balance, or request a payment plan.

This amended policy has serious consequences for clubs that are in arrears in paying their club balances. To rectify this past due condition, clubs placed on suspension may regain an active status by paying the balance in full. Beginning July 1, 2015, clubs canceled more than twice will be ineligible for reactivation. Clubs should work to avoid cancellation at all times. Please make sure your club's balance has been paid in full to LCI to ensure your active status is protected. Club presidents, secretaries and treasurers should visit www.lionsclub.org and review their statements regularly by logging into MyLCI and clicking on "My Lions Club" and then "STATEMENTS/DUES" to make sure you are up to date with your LCI balance and that all payments have been recorded.

Clubs should also send their district and state dues to CT Rose Russell in a timely manner so she doesn't have to rebill you. Our district and state operating expenses are dependent on prompt payment of district and state dues.

Lionism at Its Best in 25-G

“The Results Are All That Matter”

The first time I met Glenn Yoder he visited the Syracuse Lions Club. He had just been elected District Governor and I was president of the Syracuse Lions. He had heard about some of the changes we had made in the Syracuse Lions Club and he wanted me to serve as the district membership chairman.

I laughed and told him I had no experience in the district and he responded, “You just brought in 6 new members. Results are all that matter!”

Lion Glenn had been a salesman all his adult life. He knew that the result of what you do is all that matters. Set a realistic goal and make every effort to reach it. You don’t get paid for coming close to making the sale.

After I hesitated about accepting the district membership chairmanship he said, “If you take this job I will make you a successful District Governor in the future.”

Lion Glenn’s District Governor year was a perfect model of what a District Governor’s year should be. He started several new Lions clubs during his year and finished the year plus over 100 new members.

At the same time he realized the importance of developing each club’s pride in doing important projects in their communities and in the district. He realized that allowing women to be Lions was a vital step forward and he helped start the Elkhart Community Lions Club with all women charter members.

Twelve years later when I was elected District Governor he reminded me of his promise. He would call me at 6:00 a.m. to tell me he could help recruit that day and we would go to one of the five locations we had chosen.

As we acquired enough paid members to start the first club Lion Glenn realized we didn’t have the time and energy to help them develop their charter night and meeting operating procedures. His solution—WE NEED A CLUB DEVELOPMENT TEAM!

The team had to be familiar with all the necessary procedures to follow, have the time and patience to work with a club starting from scratch, and have easily available answers to all the questions they had. The simple solution—OUR WIVES! Lions Fran Cameron, Doris Yoder and Ann became that team and worked with all five of the new clubs that year. Their efforts not only made possible the successful chartering of the new clubs but also gave Ann and Doris the incentive to become active Lions.

Over the years Lion Glenn was active in projects all over Indiana. He was effective in getting the Lions Quest in our schools. He and Lion Doris also hosted several Lions foreign exchange students, and he traveled all over the state helping to form new clubs.

His visit to the Syracuse Lions Club and his challenge to it so long ago was the motivation which produced three District Governors in District 25-G.

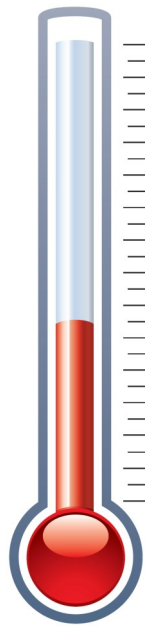

Leader Dogs for the Blind Kennel Update

During the 2014-15 Lions year District 25-G sent a total of \$2,990 to Leader Dogs for the Blind to go toward the purchase of a kennel. Donations came from the Milford Lions, Madison Township Lions, Wakarusa Lions, Argos Lions, Etna Green Lions, Elkhart Community Lions, North Webster Lions, Bourbon Lions, Elkhart Lions, First VDG Vic Fischer, PDGs Bud and Jeri Seely, and from Lion Dave and Jackie Miley in memory of PDG Bud's sister and a Christmas gift.

As of Aug. 25 when this report was sent for publication in the district newsletter, the total figure jumped to \$6,506 with donations from Sidney Lions, Elkhart Lions, 2014-15 District 25-G treasury, an anonymous gift from three generations of Lions, a gift from DG Vic's employer from knife sharpening donations, Dr. Love's collection at Banner Night, and the Mishawaka Lions.



Samatha Dalton Speaks to Students about her Leader Dog Experiences

Plans for a special presentation at Roosevelt STEAM Academy began last week when Dunlap Lion and Elkhart Schools Health Services Coordinator John McClure requested help from Lion Jeanine Juel in finding someone that could speak to the kindergarten classes about 'sight through a guide dog.' These children were studying the five senses and a Lions Leader Dog would help the children learn a different perspective about seeing. Elkhart Lion Samantha Dalton was contacted and she accepted this challenge. She is a graduate of Indiana School for the Blind and Visually Im-

paired and is currently a student at Ivy Tech Community College. She was matched with Leader Dog Natsu last summer and this was their first 'speaking engagement.' Lion Samantha explained how the dog serves as her eyes as she goes about her daily life. The students learned that service dogs are working when they have their harness on and should not be approached or petted. At the end of her presentation, she took the harness off and let the children pet Natsu, who quickly transformed from a service animal to an ordinary pet.

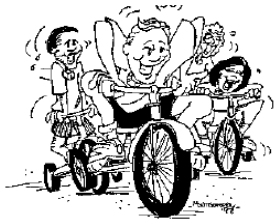
