
## Governor's Corner:

During December and January, the Lions Club International will be challenging our Lion Clubs to be part of the Centennial Service Challenge to help relieve hunger to benefit 25 million people. We can play our part in LCI's goal by organizing projects to help those folks that don't have enough food to eat, volunteer and support your local food bank, or help prepare and deliver food baskets to families in need or plan to help plant a community vegetable garden in the spring. Remember, 1 in 5 children in America lives in households that struggle to put food on the table. That equates to 16 million children struggling with hunger! In addition, 62% of America's teachers regularly see kids who come to school hungry because they aren't getting enough to eat at home! Be part of the **Centennial Service Challenge** to fight against hunger!

What a wonderful year we have had in the District of 25E! I've completed nearly 50% of my official visits and we have had two district team meetings, one in Bedford and the other in Chandler. All of the clubs that I have visited thus far have been doing outstanding community service and supporting Lionism according to our goals and objectives. We have also chartered one new Leo Club out of Dugger Union High School. In addition, we have made significant strides towards increasing our membership and retaining our current members. As of this writing, we were a -22 for the year as compared to last year when we were a -38. Also, through November we have logged in over 18,300 Lion hours and have served over 72,900 people served!



#### Special Projects October 2014

The Special Projects Committee once again will be holding a drawing to fund requests that the Special Project Committee receive from needy clubs or individuals in our District. So far this year we have given out (1) \$500 request from one club who participated in our drawing last year. We use the money from the tickets to fund projects not eligible from other sources in our District.

This year we have decided again to give \$300 going to the first place winner and \$100 to the second place winner, with a \$50 prize to the seller of the winning ticket. If your club hasn't received your raffle tickets yet, be patient, they will be handed out at the 2nd District 25-E Cabinet meeting on Sat. Nov. 15th. 
From the North: I-65 South to I-465 SW to I-70 West to exit 66. Turn right and go to 1st light and make left, then 1st left to Gateway Dr.
