

TREES: THE NATURAL MOOD BOOSTERS



Some say laughter is the best medicine. But according to recent findings, the best medicine for your mental health might just be trees. Over the years, a growing body of research has proven that regular access to trees makes us happier and healthier.

In honor of Mental Health Awareness in May, we'd like to share with you just a few of the ways trees can support your mental well-being.

Spending time in nature reduces levels of a stress hormone called cortisol. It also lowers blood pressure.

Living within 100 meters (about 300 feet) of a tree can reduce rates of depression.

Being among the trees enhances cognitive functions such as learning, thinking, and reasoning.

Walking through green space with trees can improve memory and attention span.

This month – or any month – make a conscious effort to get out and enjoy the trees around you, whether that's in your own yard or in a community space. And feel the mood-boosting benefits of nature.

PDG Paul Schoonmaker 1998-1999

Paul W. Schoonmaker, 83, a cherished husband, father, grandfather, great-grandfather, brother, and friend, was Heavenly Promoted into the arms of his sweet Jesus on July 1, 2024 at The Waters of Martinsville. Born on December 24, 1940, in the Bronx, New York, Paul's life was dedicated to service, family, and community.

Paul's journey began as a young man in the Bronx, where he was born to parents Paul Schoonmaker and Elizabeth Kramer. He was a brother to Roy, Josphine, Robert, and Anna, sharing countless memories that shaped their family. He met the love of his life, Betty (Tyson) Schoonmaker, and together they embarked on a 61-year marriage filled with love, laughter, and unwavering support.

The couple was blessed with a beautiful family, including their son Michael (Leann) Schoonmaker, daughters Veronica (John Goodpaster) Goveia, and Amy Stancombe. Paul was a proud grandfather to Alexandra (Evelyn Stier) Goveia, Kailey Stancombe, Zachary Stancombe, and Matthew Schoonmaker, and he cherished his role as a great-grandfather to Winnie Lou and Henry Goveia-Stier. His passion for helping others was also evident in his work with The Special Olympics, Meals on Wheels, Hoosier Hills Food Bank, and Area 10 on Aging, where he assisted with food deliveries and the Senior Games. Paul's faith was an integral part of his life, and he was a member of the Ellettsville House of Prayer. His ability to talk to anyone and his selfless nature made him a beloved figure in his church and community. An accomplished woodworker, Paul's scroll sawing crafts were intricate and beautiful, often given as gifts to friends and family, showcasing his talent and generosity.

Friends and family will remember Paul for his humor, friendliness, and selflessness. His ability to light up a room with a joke, his readiness to lend a helping hand, and his unwavering commitment to his loved ones and country will be deeply missed.



There is a room called The Zone. Kids can play board games or videos, work puzzles or watch TV. There is special network so that room bound kids can watch special movies that are playing, or parents can get information. There is a library to get books, do research, or parents can use to work online.

Riley Hospital is no longer a hospital for special needs children they admit all children. Most Indianapolis area babies are born there. Once a Riley kid always a Riley kid.

Indiana Lions Foundation Needs Your Help at the Indiana State Fair

Opening Day of the 2024 Indiana State Fair is just one month away. As in previous years, we will be greeting fairgoers, while selling and scanning tickets at Gate 1W on 38th Street and Gate 12 on 42nd Street. This year, we will also be working at 4 new gates at the tunnel exits from the State Fair Infield parking lot.

Incentives:

Volunteers can earn credits towards a W.P. Woods Fellowship (WPWF), or a nominal cash donation to their Lions Club or favorite Indiana Lions state project.

Early AM Shift: 5:30 am-8:30 am - 1 WPWF credit

AM Shift: 8:00 am-2:30 pm - 1 WPWF credit PM Shift: 2:00 pm-8:30 pm - 2 WPWF credits

Bring a carload of volunteers (minimum: 5) to work at the State Fair and we will help pay for the gas.

Bring a vanload of volunteers (minimum: 8) to work at the State Fair and we will help pay for the van rental and the gas.

Dress Code Reminder:

The Indiana State Fair has a dress code for volunteers working at the State Fair.

Khaki/tan or black pants, shorts or skirts. No bluejeans, please.

Lions shirts are acceptable, as are blue State Fair shirts, and plain white t-shirts.

We are asked to wear caps. If you have a Lions cap or a tan State Fair cap from previous years, those are acceptable. If you do not have a cap, we will provide you with an Indiana Lions Foundation cap.

Check-In / Check-Out Reminder:

Please be sure to check in at the Indiana Lions Foundation booth at the beginning of your shift, and check out at the same place at the end of your shift.

Directions to Indiana State Fair:

Volunteers for the Indiana Lions Foundation State Fair project should enter the fairgrounds through Gate 10, at the intersection of 42nd Street and Crittenden Avenue in Indianapolis. You should be able to use that intersection as the destination in Google Maps.

An annotated map of the Indiana State Fairgrounds is attached. Gate 10, the parking area, the Foundation's check-in booth, and our gates are highlighted.

If you have any questions about our Indiana State Fair project, please call me or send me an email message.

There are a couple of changes for this year.

- Last year, the Fair was closed on Monday and Tuesday each week; this year it will be closed only on Monday.
- Automobile entrance to infield parking will be handled differently this year. In prior years, cashiers
 collected money for auto parking fees and entrance fees on the access roads. This year, only auto
 parking fees will be charged at the access roads. Four new gates are being created on the infield,
 and Lions will sell and scan tickets at these new gates. On the website sign-in sheets they are
 designated as NW, SW, NE and SE gates.
