

Important Notice

from your Cabinet Treasurer Debbie Ellis and your Cabinet Secertary Christy Nolan



Attention ALL Club Presidents, Secretaries, & Treasurers,

For those of you who may have never been told, we want to explain to you that if you do not have your LCI dues (that you pay on the portal) or your state and district dues (that you pay to CT Debbie Ellis) paid by the cut off, (this time was March 7, 2025) (15 days prior to any convention) you can NOT vote. Some clubs have paid both, some have paid LCI but not State and District and some have paid State and District but not LCI, so if this was your club on 3/7/25 you can NOT vote at the District Convention.

This brings me to a new issue that many are not aware of. Several clubs have paid their dues but are still unable to vote because they have a balance greater than \$10 still showing in their accounts. I have discovered that most of these fees are from new members being reported but not yet paid for. I have heard many times that you have 30 days from invoice not statement date to pay. In my mind invoice and statement are the same but that is NOT TRUE! (most treasurers know this, but as a secretary I did not.) When you input a new member into the portal, it then becomes the treasurer's job to check the portal within a week from adding that member to see if the club has been billed for them. The day LCI bills you for that member's dues the 30 day count begins. If you are not checking the portal and you are waiting for the statement to be mailed to you, in most cases your bill is already late. I discovered that for those clubs who cannot vote at the District Convention but had paid their dues before the cut off are being denied to vote because of their new members' dues not being paid. While this may seem unfair, LCI has this rule in their by-laws, and they will not budge. Your CT Debbie and I wanted to make all of you aware of this rule so that you may correct this in order to be able to vote at the State Convention. (Remember...you can only have a \$0 to no more than \$10 balance on your account 15 days prior to the convention to vote.) To be assured that you can vote at the State Convention please have all LCI (on Portal), State & District Dues (mailed to CT Debbie) and any outstanding LCI invoices (on Portal) submitted by March 30th, 2025 so they will be processed in time for the convention.

** Please note that LCI will no longer be sending out statements as of July 15, 2025. Treasurers will have access to statements through the Portal moving forward. Once this begins, we will have no choice but to get on the Portal so please pass this onto any new incoming treasurers.

It's Convention & Election Time!



ENVIRONMENTAL NEWS – SPRING 2025

I read an article this week and want to share it with you.

Think about these things and make your decisions about what you eat and drink.



Microplastics are everywhere! They're in beauty products we wear, cleaning supplies we use, and even in the food we eat. Research suggests that these particles, smaller than a grain of rice, can harm reproductive, digestive, and respiratory health.

In a new scientific study, physicians report that switching from bottled water to filtered tap water could cut your microplastic intake by about 90% each year. This advice may be tough to swallow. Bottled water was America's favorite packaged drink last year (2024) according to industry data, with 16.2 billion gallons consumed. Microplastic exposure occurs when particles break off from the bottle's inner surface and enter the water, particularly when the bottle is squeezed or exposed to heat.

Stopping the practice of heating food in plastic containers could be one of the most effective ways to reduce microplastic consumption. (I've been using glass containers to microwave food for quite a while – also to store food in the fridge or freezer.)

Startling research published last month found that the human brain contains approximately a spoon's worth of tiny shreds of plastic. Researchers are calling for more studies on the long term health effects of microplastics.

How about you? Can you think of other ways to help curb the use of so much plastic?




