

What a great disaster response team this district has! In just hours of receiving the Disaster Response Grant funds, there were boots and shoes on the ground all over the district looking for folks who needed assistance. In the span of less than 2 weeks starting March 15<sup>th</sup> there were at least 11 tornadoes and major flooding in the areas of the White, Wabash, and Ohio Rivers. Help couldn't even get to folks with many roads closed due to flooding. The great news in the middle of all this is that many different groups and organizations stepped forward helping folks who were displaced, needed supplies for cleanup, clothing and personal items, tarps, totes, wheelbarrows, rakes, trash bugs, and many other items. It warms my heart to see such kindness and compassion among humans. We will finish distributing recovery items, complete the report and close the grant from LCFI and work on the plans for the next District Project... Details coming soon to a newsletter near you.

There are many things to celebrate this month: 79 (35 more will reach our goal) new members; 78% clubs reporting service on the portal; 100% clubs making donations to LCIF; and 39 clubs have completed reporting the officers for next year. District Governor Elect John has several training/learning events for all Lions but especially all Presidents, Vices, Secretaries, Treasurers and LCIF club coordinators.
