#### Hello My Friends!

Most of our Lions clubs work hard to fulfill and meet needs in our communities and we are usually glad when more folks join our desire and passion to serve others.

Several times last year, ther lions who asked how do we know if this person we want to ask to join Lions is going to be a good fit? We don't just want a warm body for a few months.

A news feed on LinkedIn caught my eye. Although aimed at supervisors and team leaders, the information can also be applied to Lions clubs. Here are 11 items that might help you as a Lion and our Lions clubs too:

- 1. Groups that work well together perform better. Each person brings their own chemistry and that influences the team's/club's chemistry. Please be prepared for changes to occur.
- 2. Different sets of eye, ears, and curiosity may bring attention to issues. The club needs to be okay with someone asking questions that may be difficult or that others avoid asking.
- 3. It takes some effort to show respect and earn loyalty. It is especially difficult when we make mistakes, we need to own that we messed up, and need to take the blame publicly. Most folks however, prefer to be given credit privately.
- 4. Thriving clubs encourage these safe spaces as opportunity for expressing themselves, maybe disagreeing with others, even having productive and constructive debates.
- 5. Clubs need to share the reason behind their decisions. New members will not always understand what is going on right away, but transparency builds trust.
- 6. One size does **NOT** fit all! Our interactions and approaches need to be different with each person... what works with Keith, probably won't work with me.
- 7. Progress is moving forward! Celebrate the small wins that build momentum and help the club achieve results.
- 8. Please, Please remember that EVERYONE makes mistakes. It's not the end of the world like in the movies where the big red button under lock and key gets pressed...Lions clubs can be the safest spaces to make mistakes and the best opportunities to learn from them.
- 9. I greatly enjoyed visiting the clubs where something unusual or something unexpected happened. Unpredictability, seeing what is coming next, is part of what keeps folks coming to meetings and events.
- 10. Do you know what the signs of burnout are? Look them up! Then look around you at the next meeting or event and I bet you will see at least 4-5 faces showing those signs. Please be that person that goes up to them during socialization to ask if they are ok, if there is anything that you can do to help. Preventing burnout is the best way to retain members.
- 11. Always, Always ask everyone and what ideas they have even with those thoughts are written down anonymously. The clubs that grow learn from each other. Each person is valued for their ideas and opinions. Others see things that we don't. Priceless!

Next time, let's touch upon things that we as humans and Lions need to unlearn.

Until then, continue making goals, writing down the steps needed to get there, bringing others along to accomplish the small wins, and reaching the results of what you are striving for!

#### **2025-26 CLUB EXCELLENCE – CHANGES**

If you would like your club to earn a 2025-2026 Club Excellence Award next year, the time to start planning is NOW, because the format from past years has changed!

First, there is no application to fill out....Lions International will look at the portal service/membership entries to determine who qualifies. Everything must be reported!

Under *Membership* a club must know what their starting membership was on July 1, 2025.

If a club had 36 members on 7/1/2025 then that club must induct a minimum of two or 20% new members whichever is greater – or sponsor a new club.....in this case 20% of 36 would be 7 new members -- if no new club sponsorship.

<u>Service Activities</u>: *Report a minimum of 4 service activities on the portal.* Three of these must show participation in each of the three international weeks of service.

#### Mental health & Wellbeing - October 4-12, 2025

Ideas: pass out flyers on suicide hotline number

PTSD walk (like a Strides Walk)

If your club meets during this week or you have someplace to hold a special meeting invite a speaker from your local hospital/clinic to speak on mental health – workplace stress, etc.

#### **Hunger – January 3-11, 2026**

Idea: collect canned food and deliver to food pantry during this week of service.

#### **Environment – April 18-26, 2026**

Idea: plant trees/flowers, adopt a highway, clean up an area, recycle event, i.e. electronics, etc.

The fourth service activity can be any service done at any time.

Leadership: Report officers by May 15 of current year

10% of club membership complete 3 courses in Lions Learning Center – (remember if you had 36 members on 7/1/2025 that would be 4 members must do this.)

Club president for the current year must not have served more than two consecutive terms.

A minimum of two or more Club Officers (president, vice-president, secretary or treasurer. Of which, one must be the club president) complete club officer training (online with the Lions Learning Center or in-person as reported by a GLT coordinator in Learn) between May 1 and December 31.

Donations: Contribute to LCIF a minimum of the club's membership total on June 30<sup>th</sup> of the previous Lions year, multiplied by US \$20.

Example: 36 members on 7/1/25 would be \$20 x 36= \$720.00

This is not as hard as it sounds....If 10 members in a 36 member club collected a jar of change monthly with \$10 each month and they did it every month for 10 months (if you start now) that would be \$1200.

10x\$10=\$100x10months = \$1200

One more tip: Make donations to EMPOWERING SERVICE instead of a stated cause. The donation will be used for the area of greatest need and not left in a category not being used. EMPOWERING SERVICE HELPS YOUR DISTRICT. If several small clubs donate, but each club donates less than \$5,000, LCIF, adds all the club donations together. When the total of all clubs reaches \$10,000, the district receives 15% back which can be saved up to 15 years and used as matching funds for LCIF district grants.

Empowering Service – is a WIN for our districts but only when you select Empowering Service.

It is also only a win when your GLT, club secretary, president, club or district administrator reports the information on the portal!






