Club attendance has gone down forcing the District to mail more and more of the packets to the bulk of our 65 clubs. That's a lot of postage (almost\$10 each) we feel that the District would be served using these funds to support Member Orientation plus Trainings. Currently it is taking a huge amount of funds from budget areas which, if our costs continue to rise, might cause the district to need for dues increase in a few years. Clubs that cannot or do not plan to pick up their packets, will have them mailed/billed at the district's cost of \$10.

..." Change in the New Year" ...we love change when we see the benefit and hate it when we don't. There are very few changes on the Club level, but they are important.

Please appoint an LCIF coordinator in your club by the end of July 2017. Why? LCI is improving funding services; it will require the name of the club LCIF chairperson to put through any grants or disaster funding that may need to be managed in your area – directly to your club! Obtain money for your community with LCIF.

Club Secretaries — entering Monthly Membership Reports (MMR) and Service Activities Reports (SAR) must go into MyLCI. This simple 10-minute (max) reporting allows us to be accurate on the number of Lions members serving, what we are doing and how many people we've helped. The SAR (formerly known as "points" must be entered online for any of the activities to count in the "contest".

Have you heard? We've broken our membership record! 1,445, 591 members worldwide. And it appears that about 30,000 of our International pride will be converging on Chicago! Secretaries — your timely MMR reports are working!! Thank you for making us look so good!

Our newsletter is shrinking! The number of words in articles and size of pictures in addition to not publishing whole flyers is another cost saving measure. There are many Lions who do not have reliable internet or Cell service to access or save large files. I know that everyone was reading ALL 36 pages of the last few newsletters, right?

Smaller pieces of information to start the year – let me know what you think. This immediate change will make access to it easier and less expensive on those who look at it digitally and those who prefer to print it off to read. Less ink, less paper, less time, less cost to our members. Expect smaller articles and more information.




