Club Excellence

The "Club Excellence Award" is a goal that all clubs should be working toward. The club that achieves it, is a club that is better serving its community and better taking care of its members; that should be the mission of all clubs!

The requirements for the award are those things that any good club should be doing: meeting regularly, paying their bills, developing their membership, providing leadership opportunities for their members, supporting their Foundation and most importantly providing service to their community.

Some of the requirements your club is probably already doing; some require planning and effort to complete.

We all know that growing our club's membership is not easy; but it can be done. Last year about 1/3 of our clubs grew; more could have done that with some planning and effort.

Most of the requirements are easy: you are already meeting regularly and doing service projects; you can easily file reports and pay your bills on time; a contribution to LCIF is easy (support of our award winning Foundation is something all clubs should do and no minimum is specified).

Leadership development opportunities are provided by the district:

Zone Meetings have been provided in most of our zones with more scheduled; the District Convention is scheduled for March 19th, in Fort Wayne, with a variety of workshops designed for all members (bring your newer members and help them broaden their perspective of Lionism). The State Convention will be held in our district (Shipshewana) in April with the same opportunities available to all members. Three

Officer Training sessions will be held in May: one in Ashley, one in Fort Wayne and one in Monroe. See that your officers are there.

During Membership Minute we have been looking back to 1917 to the beginning of Lionism. Across the country, businessmen found their clubs to be lacking something essential —Purpose. We looked at the symbolic reasons our Lions' colors were carefully chosen. We also took a close look at the objects, seeing the first object influenced by the major war of their time, is to Foster Understanding Among the Peoples of the World.

Now take a look at the delegates' impressive list of Ethics. This list serves as a vision to finding new members and an inspiration to all Lions and their clubs. The Lions Code of Ethics is a guideline for the personal values that each Lion should exemplify.

- To SHOW my faith in the worthiness of my vocation by industrious application, to the end that I may merit a reputation for quality of service.
- To SEEK success, but to accept no profit or success at the price of my own selfrespect.
- To REMEMBER that in building up my business, it is not necessary to tear down another's.
- WHENEVER A DOUBT ARISES as to the right or ethics of my position or action toward others, to resolve such doubt against myself.
- TO HOLD FRIENDSHIP AS AN END and not a means. To hold that true friendship exists, not on account of the service performed by one to another, but demands nothing and accepts service in the spirit it is given.
- ALWAYS bear in mind my obligations as a citizen to my nation, my state, and my

- community; and to give them my unswerving loyalty in word, act, and deed.
- TO AID OTHERS by giving my sympathy to those in distress, my aid to the weak, and my substance to the needy.
- And last, but not least, TO BE CAREFUL with my criticism and LIBERAL with my praise; to build up and not destroy.

This list of ethics created by the founding fathers of Lionism in October 1917 at the first convention in Dallas has served Lions well for almost 100 years.

- 10/23/2015 Property Purchased by Turnstone
- 10/09/2015 Environmental Testing, Site Design, and Zoning Approval
- 12/01/2015 Final Determination on Build-House#1/ House#2 (USABA)
- 12/15/2015 Final Zoning Approval
- 09/15/2015 to 12/31/2015 Requested Funding from District 25B Clubs
- Verified the collection of the required US \$50,000 in local matching funding.
- The clubs of District 25B have exceeded our goal by \$3,677.97.
- 01/15/2016 placed an order for a plaque bearing the LCIF Logo.

At this time Adventure Homes & Dealer is requesting additional funds; thus the project is on hold. Turnstone and USABA group are determining and negotiating the final home/delivery and installation price.


