Greetings Lions,

Our Lions year ended back in June. With the end of the year, it is time to do our taxes. Clubs can do the Federal 990N and the State NP-20R online. It should take about 10 minutes or less to complete. For the Indiana tax form, clubs will have to create an account using the Intime program on the Department of Revenue's website. The Department changed when you need to file depending on your tax-exempt ID number. Clubs should have received a letter explaining this change. If you have not received the letter and need further information you can contact the Indiana Department of Revenue. This needs to be completed to keep your tax-exempt status and to stay in good standing with LCI.

Please remember that all Lions clubs, districts and multiple districts with annual gross receipts less than US\$50,000 that are not required to file Forms 990 or 990-EZ must file the e-Postcard (also known as the 990-N). Please be advised this filing relates specifically to the 501(c)(4). If your Lions club, district or multiple district has a foundation, which is a separate legal entity, the appropriate form will need to be filed as well.

Please note that Lions Clubs International is not authorized to provide guidance regarding your filing. For specific questions, please contact a local tax professional or the IRS.

Rules for Redeeming State Fair Credits Announced

A person (Lion or non-Lion) may use their state fair credits in one of three ways as follows:

- Expend 10 of their accumulated credits for a W. P. Woods Fellowship for oneself or to give to another person (Lion or non-Lion) in recognition of their commitment to community service
- Expend 10 of their accumulated credits for a \$200 Community Service Grant for a Lions club located in Indiana. A check for \$200 will be made out to the designated club and mailed to the person using the credits for their presentation to the club in a manner of their choosing.
- 3. Expend 10 of their accumulated credits for a grant to one of the five Indiana Lions state projects, LCIF, one of the seven MD25 districts or the Indiana Lions Foundation. A check for \$200 will be made out to the designated state project, LCIF, district or the Foundation and mailed to the requesting person for their presentation to the receiving organization. A person may wish to present the check to one of their district trustees of the designated state project or perhaps mail the check with a cover letter to the state project with a personal note relating why they are supportive of the work of that state project.

A person (Lion or non-Lion) can transfer their credits to an Indiana club, an MD25 District or to another Lion. Two or more Lions who don't have 10 accumulated credits as individuals could band together and decide to transfer their credits to one person or to a club, who could then amass the required 10 credits to use in one of the three ways stated above. A Lion or non-Lion may wish to transfer their credits to an MD25 District to allow the District Governor to present W. P. Woods fellowships.

In a fiscal year (July 1 to June 30) a person or club may only use 10 of their accumulated credits either for the \$200 Community Service Grant to a club or for a \$200 grant to one of the state projects, LCIF, MD25 district or the Foundation.

Margaret Julien—Zionsville Lions



Margaret "Meg" Anna Ramey Julien was born April 10, 1924 to John Ruby Ramey and Cora Mildred Bowen Ramey in Tippecanoe County, near Petit, IN. She attended school in Delphi, IN and graduated from Delphi High School in 1942. She went to college in Lafayette, IN and was initiated into the Delta Gamma sorority in April, 1945. She graduated from Purdue University in 1946. She taught school in Logansport and Flora, IN. She was married to Eran H Julien on Dec. 19, 1948. Eran was also one of her classmates throughout their schooling in Delphi. Margaret taught second and sixth grade students in the Eagle Elementary school system from 1960 to 1968. In the fall of 1968, she changed positions to be in charge of the Eagle Elementary school library. She was in charge of the Eagle and Pleasant View school libraries until her retirement in 1989. She received a Masters degree of Library Sciences from Butler University. She was former President of the Hussey Mayfield Library Board from 1983-1993 and helped to supervise construction of the Hussey Mayfield Library – Zionsville branch at 250 N. Fifth Street, which opened January 31, 1994.

Margaret helped form and organize the Delphi chapter of the Tri Kappa sorority and was President of Tri Kappa in Zionsville from 1972 – 1973. Margaret was the first

woman member of the Zionsville Lions Club and she and Eran were very active in the Lions Club's support of Leader Dogs for the Blind. She is very proud to be the Grand Marshall of the 2016 Lions Club Parade. Margaret and Eran were members of Zionsville United Methodist Church for over 70 years. They loved traveling and visited many European countries over the years after Margaret retired from the school system in 1989

Margaret was very active in the Zionsville Woman's Club and was President of the club from 1998-1989.
