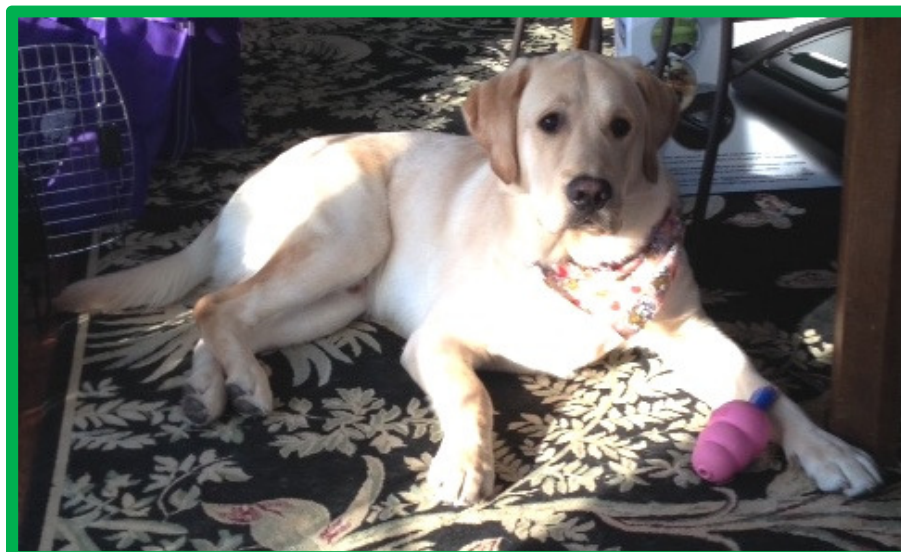

## ID Kembra Smith, International Director



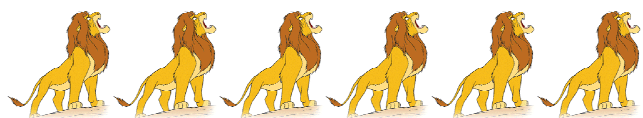

## Your Indiana Lions Speech and Hearing Project at Work

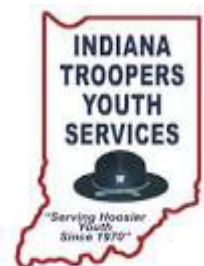


Since July 1, 2015, 36 Hearing aids have been loaned to low income individuals in 25 D. Plus 2 hearing aids were procured through the Lions Affordable Hearing Aid Project. Communities served include: Albany, Anderson, Carmel, Elwood, Hartford City, Gas City, Greentown, Kokomo, Muncie, Winchester, and Yorktown.

Your Speech and Hearing state project has provided grants of over \$48000 since July 1st. Grants include: Funds to provide camperships to Indiana Deaf Camp and HEAR Indiana Listening and Spoken Language Camp, camperships to 5 students from Indiana School for the Deaf to the Deaf Youth Leadership Camp in Oregon, grants for scholarships, equipment, and research at BSU, IU, ISU, and PU. Speech and Hearing has just been awarded a matching grant from LCIF to update the Augmentative Assistive Communications Library equipment and the purchase of 30 new digital hearing aids for the hearing aid loaner bank.

All of this is made possible by the generous contributions of the Lions Clubs in District D and throughout the state. Your District D Trustees thank you for your support and encourage you to continue to do so. Remember a \$500 contribution over a 2 year period provides your club with the opportunity to honor a member with a Richard T. Miyamoto Fellowship.
