Another need? Yes, keep on going and you will see that everywhere around you there is one or more needs, more now than ever before.

With this message I am asking each Lion in District 25C to step out of your surroundings immediate and participate in a larger humanitarian effort. Sometimes we see the service that we do in our clubs as the total service necessary to take care of the prevailing needs. NOT TRUE!!! I know that most clubs do service "outside" by giving to the state projects, i.e., Cancer Control, Leader Dog.

ISBVI, Speech & Hearing, and the Eye Bank supporting the Indiana Lions Foundation and yes, even LCIF.

The easy way to do service is just pass on a Don't get me check. wrong! That check is also needed and very much appreciated, but we need "hands on" service also. I can't help but think of the news item just a short time ago where a policeman bought diapers for woman caught shoplifting. Why was she shoplifting? She was living in a car with six children. Is there any question in your mind about her situation? Would you say there is a need there?

We need to do more "outside" the club, or if inside the club, we need to know that this situation doesn't exist in community, or if it does. find out when, where and why and do something about it! Other examples of service are the Special Olympics. the Reading Action Program and engaging in food pantries, preparing meals for

disadvantaged children, and vision screening. Clubs are doing some or all of these. More need to start.

I have tried to make a point about service. In District C we have had an excellent kick off for the 2015-2016. I would encourage you to get involved. Do a self-assessment, check to make sure you are doing all **you** can to help those less fortunate.

The leaves are changing color and beginning to fall and as we begin to enjoy cooler temperatures and football games, it won't be long before we enter the holiday season which is closely followed by "tax" season.

As you begin to think about the coming seasons, and planning your yearcharitable end contributions for 2015. please consider a personal donation to the Melvin Fellowship Jones Program. Individuals may make personal contributions online at www.lionsclubs.org and clicking on LCIF Button. Be sure to include vour club and district number. Honor someone special by making a donation in their name to LCIF.

Last year 35 of our 57 participated clubs making a contribution to 22 clubs did not LCIF. make a contribution to LCIF.

This year we hope to have 100% participation of the 56 clubs in the district either through the Melvin Jones Fellowship program or an undesignated donation to LCIF. The District's goal this year is \$11,665 which is increase of 10% over the 2014-2015 vear. contribution to LCIF is one

of the requirements for "Club obtaining а Award" Excellence "Club and/or the President's Excellence Award." The DG is asking those clubs who contributed last year to increase last year's donation by a minimum of 10%. For only an additional \$10 ten lives can be saved through the Measles Initiative.

Three great days of informative seminars --- 90 sessions total with my particular interest focused on membership issues: "Hello, I'm your new member...I'm leaving", "Community Service Builds Clubs", "Member Retention", "Use of Social Media to Attract Members", "Just Ask – Recruiting New Members", "Power of Diversity", "Orientation for Member Retention" and "Recruiting Younger Members". During the Just Ask session, we talked about the Top 10 Motivators that bring new members into our clubs. I'd like to share these with you. Some you'll know, but there may be others that might give you an aHa moment.

8.

I. Someone <u>asked</u> them. (duh!)

- They have <u>untapped skills</u> they can use by volunteering with our organization.
- They care deeply about our organization's missions, and/or <u>social</u> 7. <u>change</u>.
 - They want training or might want the experience as a credential for their job or resume.
- They feel a need to <u>pay back society</u> for help or opportunities they have received.
- They actively enjoy the kind of work that volunteering brings; it's fun for them.
- They are motivated to try to <u>improve the quality of life in</u> their community.
- They enjoy the <u>social aspect</u>, and contact with other members.
- They seek the external <u>recognition</u> and internal <u>good feeling</u> that comes with volunteering.
- 10. It makes that feel needed and useful.

What motivated you to join your club? Take a look around at your own community leaders, relatives, friends, neighbors, local professionals, people you do business with and colleagues.....seems to me that you probably know folks in each of these groups whose lives are inspired by one, two or more of these motivators. So make a list of your contacts, figure out what motivates them and use these keys to light their passion to join your club!
