Hello Lions!

As the Lions' year comes to a close, it is a good time to reflect on the successes and challenges of the year.

For the District, overall it was a successful year. We had several clubs added multiple members. Overall member retention remains at a high level and we have no open trustee or Vice District Governor positions. We currently facing the challenges of learning a new reporting system, the Lions Portal. We also had the challenges of losing several clubs.

Let's address the challenges. The Lions Portal, despite changing systems in the 3rd quarter, the club officers seem to be willing to learn the program and are adapting quicker than I thought they would. Spoiler Alert! This could be your club!

Of all the clubs that closed, each of them had an aging membership and waited too long to get serious about recruiting new members. Everyone wants younger members, targeting potential members 25-35 years younger than themselves. Try recruiting someone 5-10 years younger instead. Once they are comfortable in the club, they can start recruiting someone 5-10 years younger than they are.

Another common issue was a lack of signature focus. A signature focus in your community helps everyone know the club. It also helps in recruiting members if folks have a working knowledge of what the Lions do!

The last item was none of the current members wanted to hold the office of president. I agree that the president office is important and can be scary. But I know your club is not going to let you fail as President. They may not agree with everything in the club, but they will not let you fail. These clubs decided to close because no one wanted to step up an say "I will run for President" and instead decided to vote to close.

None of these clubs wanted to close, but these challenges just overwhelmed the members. If your club is having any of these challenges or others, please bring them to the district leaders' attention. The district can't help if they don't know there is an issue.

So, Thank You District Governor Glen for a great year. District Governor Elect Erica, we are behind you ready to help you have a great year!
