#### Hope you all enjoyed your Holidays

By now, Christmas is in the rearview mirror and you are quickly passing the New Years events and looking forward to having a beautiful, healthy, safe and prosperous New Year in 2025. Anyone else sick of leftovers though?

But I'd like to take the rest of my time in this newsletter to what I see as a growing concern. With the push on Mission 1.5 to recruit new (and implied, younger) members, I see a growing "friction" as I travel around the district. Here's what I've observed FROM TIME TO TIME.

#### **Bridging the Generational Divide in Lions Clubs International**

Lions Clubs International (LCI) has long been a beacon of community service, uniting people from diverse backgrounds to work towards common goals. However, as with any organization that spans multiple generations, LCI faces its own set of challenges when it comes to bridging the gap between younger and older members. Generational conflict, while not unique to LCI, can pose significant hurdles to our collective mission if not addressed with empathy and understanding.

#### **Understanding the Root Causes**

Generational conflict within LCI often stems from differences in values, communication styles, and expectations. Older members, who have dedicated decades to the club, might prioritize traditional methods and long-standing practices. Meanwhile, younger members bring fresh perspectives, tech-savviness, and a desire for modernization. These differing viewpoints can sometimes clash, leading to misunderstandings and friction.

#### The Impact on Club Dynamics

When generational conflict arises, it can affect the dynamics within a club in several ways:

- Communication Breakdown: Differences in communication preferences—such as email versus social media—can lead to misunderstandings and feelings of exclusion.

- Resistance to Change: Older members may resist new ideas and technologies introduced by younger members, fearing that these changes might undermine established traditions.
- Engagement and Retention: If younger members feel their ideas are not valued, they may become disengaged and less likely to remain active in the club.

#### Strategies for Bridging the Gap

To ensure that generational differences do not hinder our mission, LCI clubs can adopt several strategies to foster intergenerational harmony:

- 1. Open Dialogue: Encourage open and respectful conversations where members of all ages can share their perspectives. Creating a safe space for dialogue can help bridge understanding and reduce conflicts.
- 2. Mentorship Programs: Pairing older members with younger ones in mentorship relationships can facilitate knowledge transfer and mutual respect. This not only helps younger members learn from the experience of their elders but also allows older members to gain fresh insights.
- 3. Inclusive Decision-Making: Ensure that members of all ages are included in decision-making processes. This inclusivity demonstrates that every member's voice is valued and important.
- 4. Embrace Technology: While older members might be hesitant to adopt new technologies, providing training and support can ease the transition. Embracing technology can improve communication and streamline club activities.
- 5. Celebrate Diversity: Recognize and celebrate the diverse strengths that each generation brings to the table. Hosting events that highlight different contributions can foster a sense of unity and shared purpose.

#### Conclusion

Generational conflict is a natural part of any organization that spans multiple age groups. However, by embracing open communication, fostering mutual respect, and leveraging the strengths of each generation, Lions Clubs International can turn potential conflicts into opportunities for growth. By working together, we can ensure that LCI remains a vibrant and inclusive community, united in its mission to serve and make a positive impact on the world.

In summary, new members know there are club members with lots of experience that have run lots of Pancake Breakfast because well, the older members often tell them. On the other

hand, younger members should want the help of members who often have 20 or more years' experience running events. Perhaps one way to do it would be that the Chairperson of any event to provide a written 1–2-page summary at the conclusion of any event.

I used to put what was necessary for Service Activity Reports at the top: like Tickets sold, revenue generated less expenses which equaled Funds Raised. I then listed all the sources of the things that were used in the activity like the company/store, etc. Also, any sponsors by company and contact at the company. Then I listed the volunteers by name and hours worked and whether they were Lions or family members/friends. Finally, I had a Lessons Learned Section where I mentioned things that didn't go exactly the way we would have liked.

So, when some new took over my event, I simply mailed that person 3-4 years' worth of summaries. It's a non-threatening way to give advice. Did the new Chairperson do it exactly the way I did it? Not really, but I can honestly say what they changed was for the better. By doing it this way I was essentially saying that my advice is free, and they're free to ignore it.

sessions that will give you an overview of a specific topic. Speed learning gives you the opportunity to learn about a number of topics in a very short time. When you arrive at this session, you will


select a topic that interests you. After approximately 12 minutes, everyone will switch to a new topic. At the end, you will have received an overview of four topics that interest you.

# News Around the District—Door Village Lions & Salvation Army

On Thursday December 12th at 9"30 AM, in preparation for the annual Salvation Army Gifts for Qualifying Families program, Door Village Lions club members delivered \$500 worth of special age specific Christmas gifts for teen aged family members of families receiving assistance at Christmas. Lion Bonnie Olson, a regular volunteer at La Porte Salvation Army, when helping pack items for this project, noticed that gift being donated by various entities in the community somehow did not include gifts appropriate for early teen aged children, she brought the concern to a club meeting and in the process, club members voted to purchase gifts for the program. Being a mother and a grandmother, and with some quizzing of her teen aged grandchildren, she quickly zeroed in on some of the kinds of things teens were putting on their wish list and she went out and purchased all she could for the set dollars appropriated by the club. Lion Bonnie and Lion Sue Kaiser also donated several ageappropriate gifts to add to the \$500 worth the club donated, so the total donation was close to \$600 to help a few more children enjoy Christmas.

This all led up to the previously mentioned 9"30AM visit to deliver boxes of gifts to be included in the packets being prepared for client families. Lions Dennis and Cindy Fischer, Carrie Pera, Gene Flickinger and George Morley arrived and began carrying boxes in and putting them in the sanctuary as a stopping off place before being moved to the packing area. Food Pantry Coordinator Linda Neese explained how the packets are assembled and made ready for families to pick them up at the appointed time. She also introduced Lions to Major Katie who with her husband Charles are the assigned Pastors at the La Porte Salvation Army. They direct the several ongoing programs that are currently actively being pursued. A few of which Linda explained to Lion members include the afore mentioned Family Christmas Gifts, helping 390 families; Weekend Nutrition Backpacks for elementary school students, helping 758 students; Christmas Kits for Foster Families, helping 185 families. And of course, the ongoing Food Bank they are so famous for, helping all those struggling to supplement thinly strained budgets.

Door Village Lions have been conducting a Candy Day Sale twice a year at the La Porte Post Office and for more than 10 years running have been donating all the October collections to the Salvation Army Food Bank because of the obvious need, and members are more than pleased to be contributing to the Special Teen Targeted Christmas Gifts projects as well. Club members, when referring to the Salvation Army always agree it is among the topmost deserving organization they have the pleasure of working with.

Please note that the completed design will be NO larger than 1 ¼ inch to 1 ½ inch in diameter when it is finished, so make your design includes all of the above while maintaining clarity.

Each Club can submit one design. If there are multiple designs submitted by one district, one design will be selected by the District Governor. All District designs need to be submitted to your district chair by January 3, 2025. You can scan and attach it to an email and send it to <a href="mailto:pccmsg@comcast.net">pccmsg@comcast.net</a>. Each District's selected design will be presented to the State Council on January 19, 2025. You will be notified if your design was chosen. Remember: pin designers do not have to be (a) Lions, you do NOT need to be a professional designer, and jewelers can clean up your drawings.
