As I picked up my Lions' magazine the president's message and title caught my eye.


"We're the King of the Jungle." It was interesting as he talked about American being "an incubator of innovation." How Lions clubs lead the way in community service. Something that continues today.

Lions Districts will select one winning photo to be submitted to the Multiple District by March 15, 2018.

Lions Multiple Districts are to select and submit one winning photo to Lions Club State Environmental Chair by April 1, 2018.

Indiana State Lions Club Environmental Committee will display multiple district-level entries at the State Convention in Muncie, IN.

 $\mathbf{1}^{st}$  and  $\mathbf{2}^{nd}$  place winners will receive an award, and  $\mathbf{1}^{st}$  place photos will be displayed in the Hoosier Lion.

#### 2017-2018 Contest Rules

The 2017-2018 Environmental Photo Contest is open to LIONS and LEOS in good standing.

There will be four divisions: Wildlife 18 & under, Wildlife 19 & older, Scenery 18 & under, and Scenery 19 & older.

There will be a 1st and 2nd place winner per each division.

All photos depicting a nature theme (such as plants, urban or natural landscape, animals, weather phenomenon, annual theme, etc.) are welcome.

Photos must be original and unaltered.

Photos must be taken within the community the Lions or Leos Club serves.

Photos that include people will be disqualified.

Photos must be printed on high-quality photo paper and measure  $8" \times 10"$  (20.3 x 25.4 cm.)

Photos should be submitted with the entry form included at the bottom of this page.

Only one photo each to the district.

Lions Districts should select and submit one winning photo to the Multiple District by March 15, 2018.

Submissions must be submitted to the District Environmental Chair by April 1, 2018.

#### Awards

1st Place: \$25 gift card, certificate, and photo will be displayed at the State Convention and within the Hoosier Lion.

2<sup>nd</sup> Place: Certificate

If possible, winners will be recognized at the State Convention. Winners and runner-up should be recognized at district cabinet meetings.

Photographers accept responsibility for the cost of taking and processing all photos.

Contest photos become the property of INDIANA STATE LIONS CLUB ENVIRONMENTAL COMMITTEE. INDIANA STATE LIONS CLUB ENVIRONMENTAL COMMITTEE reserves the right to disqualify entries that do not meet contest criteria or that may be viewed as inappropriate or objectionable.

At all levels of the competition, photos will be judged impartially based on originality, artistic merit, and technical quality.
