INDIANA LIONS SPEECH AND HEARING PROJECT

LCIF FOUNDATION

Why LCIF? Because through LCIF Grants we are truly accomplishing big things right here in Indiana! I know the common perception is that all our LCIF donations are shipped out of the country, but the truth is that LCIF awards a lot of grants right here in the US, in fact, more than 3 dollars are returned for every dollar donated in the US. Recently Indiana Clubs have received \$150,000 to build a new cabin from a 3:1 matching grant for Diabetes at Camp Until There's a Cure. This camp provides children with Diabetes with the skills they need to manage their diabetes in everyday life. One club or district in Indiana could not have accomplished this goal without help from YOU and LCIF. Westfield Lions received a \$2,250 grant from a partnership between LCIF and Elevance Health Foundation to help with Food Insecurity, distributing food to 219 children in WESTFIELD INDIANA every week, an example of how LCIF is supporting Hoosier Families.

I know I keep asking you for support for LCIF, true, here's a little of my "WHY". There are so many causes around the world that are worth supporting, and if you or I try to support all of them, we'll make ourselves crazy. LCIF's Global Causes are Vision, Youth, Disaster Relief, Humanitarian assistance, Diabetes, Childhood Cancer, The Environment, and Hunger. All of them are just that, GLOBAL and relevant right in our own back yard. Next, when you are choosing where to send your money, you may want to ask how much actually makes it to the point of need. 100% of LCIF Donations reach the point of need. I think if you do a little digging, there are few, if any other causes or groups that even come close to that percentage, I know, I've looked, and while I'm not going to name them here, there are some funds that I will not support, many make regular appearances on my television. Most of the charities on television ask you for around \$20.00 a month, and while that may work for them, by comparison, \$3.00 isn't much, however if able, please consider giving a little more.
