GREAT JOB! Now for the not so good news, we've lost 40 Lions, so our mid-year balance is at 1009. So, we all have some work to do, but I know we can do it. LCI has all sorts of tools and techniques for gaining and retaining members, but it all begins when we ask a friend to come to a meeting, or even better a service project. We can do this together, we just have to stay vigilant and work through the end of the year and hit that goal!

FREE TEACHER LIBRARY

A quick update on the free teacher library. The effort continues. We are still working on expanding our network for book suppliers and project supporters. At the moment the shelves are empty, wiped out by mid-year graduates no doubt. Not to worry, there's still money in the bank and re-stocking will take place in time for graduation. Thank you for supporting this project and stay tuned for future updates.

A few years ago, someone asked me if I'd be a zone chairperson and, frankly I didn't know what the implications of accepting would be. One of the proposed amendments is to allow the Council to appointed an assistant comptroller.

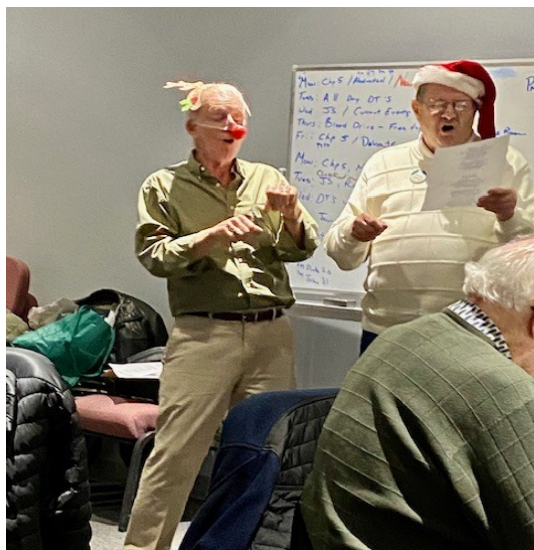
Other amendments deal with times of registration and voting, who and why a special convention can be called and there is one to bring the appointment of the Council Chair more in line with the international constitution and by-laws.

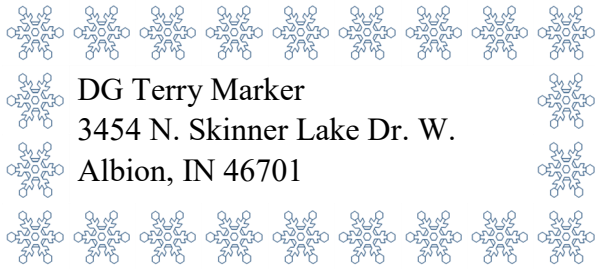
