DISTRICT GOVERNOR'S COLUMN

Congratulations to PDG Roger Cash and District 25B for our growth in membership last year. Our district ended the year with a plus 4 (or 10 depending on what criteria are used). This is the first growth in membership for our district in seven years. Now the goal is to have two years of consecutive growth. If we accomplish my membership goal this year, we should end the year over 1300. My goal is that each club will have a net gain of at least one. Now realistically, I know this won't happen. But if several clubs gain more than one, and other clubs can keep their losses to a minimum, then we should be able to do it. Let's use the Andrews club as an example. They brought in 13 new members this past year. The only drops were from two deaths. I asked one of their club members what they did to gain so many new members and she replied, "Just ask". That is exactly what LCI has stressed the past several years. We just need to ask. How many of your friends have not been asked? How many of your relatives have not been asked? How many of your fellow neighbors or church members have not been asked? Let's really strive for that goal of a +51 for the district.

I would also like to work with those clubs that have a membership of 10 or less. If your club falls in that category and you would like some help building your club, please contact me. We are going to work with four clubs throughout the year. I would like to target one club each in September/October, November/December, January/February, and March/April.

Remember that we are trying to raise as a district \$15,000 as our share in the matching LCIF grant to finish the basements for the athletes at Turnstone. We need to have this money raised by mid-November. If each club would send a contribution of \$12 per member, we can achieve that goal.

Banner Night is Saturday, October 20. It will be held at Ziano's on Maysville Road starting at 6:30 p.m. PID Linda Tincher will be our speaker for the evening. Save the date now. Registration forms will be in the September and October newsletters. Here's looking forward to an evening of fun!

Please continue to get pictures and club announcements in to Lion Jean Howard by the 20th of each month for the newsletter. It's great to see what all the clubs are doing to promote Lionism in their community.

INDIANA LIONS FOUNDATION NEEDS YOUR HELP

Please volunteer to work at the Indiana State Fair The Indiana Lions Foundation provides ticket sellers and ticket scanners at four gates at the Indiana State Fair. The fair runs from Friday August 3rd—Sunday, August 19th. More than 600 shifts need to be filled over this 17 day period. This is the single largest fundraiser for the Foundation and the money is used to provide Foundation Grants to individual clubs. If you have not worked at the State Fair as a ticket seller or scanner for a few years you will be pleasantly surprised at the ease of performing the jobs. The computer terminals are working very well. Selling tickets requires only pushing three buttons. Scanning tickets requires only that the worker hold the hand held scanner over the bar-coded ticket and press the trigger. Most positions are sitting and two of the four gates have air conditioned booths for the ticket sellers. The Tunnel Gate may require some standing, although that is not normally a busy gate. Two shifts are available to work. The morning shift is 7:30 a.m.—3:00 p.m.. The afternoon shift is 1:30 p.m.—9:00/9:30 p.m.. In return for working, the Indiana Lions Foundation is offering W.P. Woods Fellowship credits for workers—one credit for the morning shift and two credits for the afternoon shift. It takes 10 credits to earn a regular W.P. Woods and 12 credits for the Centennial Plate. This is the last year the Centennial plate will be offered. There are a limited number of plates available and when they are gone, they are gone. Bring a car load of Lions and friends and join us at the Fair this year. You may use the Foundation website to volunteer at

Well by sending the project information to Lions International your club will receive credit for all your service projects that you work on in the form of banner patches and other things..

Most clubs will appoint this job to there club Secretary, but any other Lion can fill this position. When the club M.M.R. is filled out each month the G.S.T. report can be filled out as well. Lets be the first District to have every club with a G.S.T. member assigned to this position.

**W.P. WOODS CHAIR RE-

You may be unaware that you have W.P. Woods credits or donations in an inactive account. An inactive account is one having no activity for five or more years. These credits and donations are waiting to be used for W.P. Woods Fellowships.

The Indiana Lions Foundation Board of Trustees discussed options for these forgotten credits and donations, and agreed to notify account owners or owners' clubs, and voted on the following options for owners:

Reactivate the account with a donation of \$5 or more;

Notify the W.P. Woods Chair to transfer the credits or donations to another club member;

Notify the W.P. Woods Chair to give the credits and donations to your District.

The Trustees will notify account owners, or their clubs, by mail. Credits and donations in accounts not acknowledged by owners or their clubs within sixty days after receiving the Trustees' letters will be transferred to the Districts in which they originated. Accounts of clubs that no longer exist will be transferred to the District in which the club once existed.

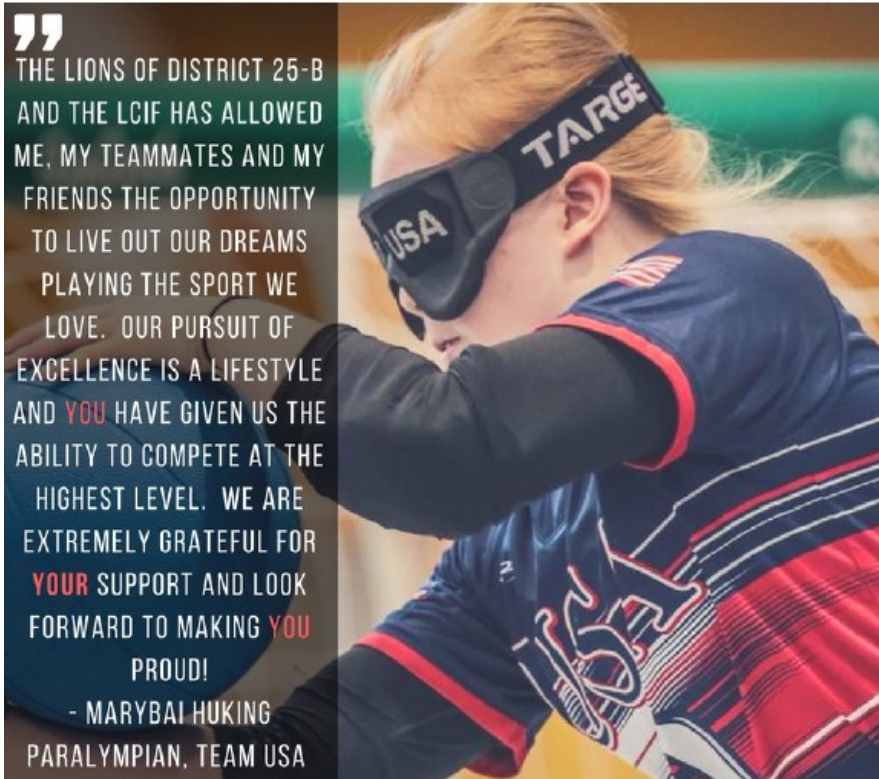
