We are now kicking off a new Lion year. We want it to be a year of service and growth. So how do we achieve that? We do that by first growing our club in membership and in number. Let's take a look at how we can grow the membership in each club while extending our reach by developing new clubs.

Step one is to get in place a team lead by the club's membership chairperson.

Step two is to create a plan on how we want to grow.

Step three is to get the club on board to ensure the plan is carried out.

Let look at each step a little closer. One of the key members of the leadership team in the club is the membership chairperson. This person has a number of duties.

One of his or her duties are to determine what the members like and don't like about your club. Another duty. with the help of the membership, is to make a list of prospects.

Now the hard part, get the members to ask the prospects to a meeting or service project and then to join the club.

Now as the club looks to grow, they need also to look at extending to other areas.

There are two ways of achieving that. One way is to sponsor a new club. This means bringing in 20 new members.

The second way is the starting of a Branch Club. A Branch Club only needs five members to get started. The branch club members count as part of the parent club's membership.

Who can volunteer to work for the Indiana Lions Foundation at the Indiana State Fair? A person need not be a Lion to volunteer at the Indiana State Fair. Ask your friends, your children, and grandchildren to volunteer – all are welcome who are at least 15 years old.

What are the starting and ending times for the shifts? There are four shifts available this year. The start time listed for each shift is the time you are expected to check in at our booth. These times have changed from previous years.

- 8:00 am—2:30 pm Volunteers on this shift will earn 1 W.P. Woods credit.
- 2:00 pm—8:30 pm Volunteers on this shift will earn 2 W.P. Woods credits.
- 4:00 pm—8:30 pm Volunteers on this shift will earn 1 W.P. Woods credit.
