July has been a busy and energizing month! From attending conferences to the inspiring Lions Clubs International Convention in Orlando, and preparing for upcoming service events, there has been a lot happening. I'm excited to share some important updates regarding Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF).

### DISTRICT HIGHLIGHTS

First, I'm thrilled to report that our District Governor's Community Improvement Grant is officially active in New Haven! Stay tuned for progress updates—this is a powerful example of your LCIF donations at work in our own backyard.

Next, let's celebrate some incredible news: Our total district donations for the year reached \$30,058.27, exceeding our goal of \$30,028.27—we did it! □ □

So, what does this mean for us? □ 15% of that total—\$4,508.74—is now available for use within our district through Community Impact Grants. This is an amazing opportunity for us to bring even more support to our local communities.

### GLOBAL IMPACT

LCIF continues to make a global difference: \$12,088,340.34 was donated from Constitutional Area 1 (USA and Affiliates: Bermuda and the Bahamas) \$81,579,545 was donated worldwide Where does this money go?
