March Newsletter

District 25C held its District Convention on Saturday, February 25, 2022. The pre-conference dinner and tour were on the day before. Weather and COVID reduced attendance, but all who came had a good time of friendship, service, and shared information.

Unfortunately, our guests, International Director Larry Edwards, and his wife Lion Susan, spent Thursday and part of Friday stranded in the Pittsburg Airport. Three flights were cancelled, and their baggage was in Washington DC. They returned home. They were able to take part in our convention via zoom. We missed the opportunity for me and our fellow Lions to informally interact with ID Larry and Susan Edwards. They are so warm and friendly.

On Friday, we met with staff of the Hoosier Burn Camp. This group helps statewide and not only holds a week camping experience for children who were burned, but also family gatherings for those with children too young for camp. There are many other activities throughout the year as donated tickets, etc. and other smaller outings. Lions can help their local children with gas cards for travel to events, or help with local families with other needs. PID Linda Tincher provided their information on Saturday to the convention.

On Saturday, when we introduced PCC Sue Topf, our retiring MD25 Administrative Secretary, she was given a standing ovation as thank you for her excellent service and friendship to the Lions of Indiana and 25C.

Twenty-seven (27) Lions who passed away since our last convention were remembered in a memorial service led by Rev. Lion Jennifer Drapalik.

ID Larry Edwards and his wife Lion Susan added a great deal to our convention, both in their speeches and in the conversation with PID Nick Xinopoulos and Lion Gretchen about the fishing project for impaired individuals in North Carolina that both couples volunteer to help.

PCC Sue Topf and the District 25C members who had gone on the eyeglass missions to Mexico shared experiences and their sense of making a difference. Not only did they help those at the clinic, but they referred their bus driver, one of their guards, and their hotel clerk to come to the clinic.

It is important for us to realize that some of those eyeglasses that we collect will enable someone to see more clearly. Lions make a difference.

There is another area that the Lions in 25C and in MD make a difference –vision screening children. Between July 1, 2021, and December 31, 2021, District 25C's Lions have vision screened 22,210 children. There is only one

district in CA1 (basically US) that screened more children with 22,331 screened. (I just received the plaque and patch recognizing the award.) MD 25's Lions have screened 49,970



Children, which is second in multiple-districts in Constitutional Area 1 (CA-1).

We ended by packing 50 hard eyeglass cases with first aid supplies. These cases contain various sizes of bandages, alcohol swabs, and packets of antibiotics and of anti-itch medicines. I will distribute them on my next Official Visits.

Lions Clubs and Special Olympics

Did you know?

Lions Clubs International and Special Olympics have been in partnership since 2001, in a multi-year, multi-million-dollar commitment in the expansion of the Opening Eyes vision screening program. Since 2001, LCIF has provided over \$27 million to Special Olympics for activities that include Opening Eyes, Family Health Forums, Healthy Hearing, Special Smiles, and inclusive sports for individuals with intellectual disabilities.

Are you aware?

In 2016 the Indiana Lions were asked if they would consider becoming a Sponsoring Partner in the Indiana Winter Special Olympics? At that time, there was a real possibility that the Games might be moved to Michigan or cancelled due to increased costs and reduced participation. Currently, the Michigan winter games are held in Traverse City which is a 400-mile trip from Indianapolis. The trip alone would make it extremely hard for many Indiana athletes to participate. With the partnership in place, the cost of the Games has stabilized, and participation has been on the rise. Supporting the Winter Games today will insure they will continue for our future athletes. The games provide life changing opportunities for our athletes that they would otherwise never have.

Have you heard?

It currently costs around \$20,000.00 to fund the winter games, with the Lion's share (pun intended) being half of that; \$10,000.00. This gives us the title of Sponsoring Partner and the recognition that comes with it. Each district has been asked to contribute \$1500.00. Many clubs may not be aware we are involved in this endeavor since, in the past the funds were collected by holding a golf outing and raising funds through hole sponsorship and game fees. That was not an option this year.

Will you help?

This letter has been written for two reasons; first to make all our District C clubs aware of our involvement and secondly, to ask if your club might consider making room in its budget for the Indiana Special Olympics Winter Games. If every club would send at least \$1.00 per member, our goal can be met with ease.

Please give this your consideration and contact me if you need to know where to send your contribution.




