Preparation is underway to begin rolling out the new Lion Portal. Here is some important information to prepare you for launch.

Phased rollout for Lion Account Users

Our target launch window is April 15 – May 13*. During this time, all current Lion Account users will receive an email inviting them to access the new Lion Portal**. We're doing this phased rollout to ensure staff are available to provide the best support possible and offer you a positive introductory experience.

- Now April 11: MyLion, MyLCI and Insights will continue to function as normal.
- April 12 and beyond: MyLion, MyLCI and Insights are no longer available.
- April 15 May 13: Invitations to access the new Lion Portal sent via email on a rolling basis to existing Lion Account users.

Please note: User permissions will not change. In other words, those who can report service, access member data and other key functions remains the same.

 May 13 and beyond: All visitors attempting to access the previous digital tools will be automatically redirected to the new Lion Portal.

*Dates are subject to change. Our number one goal is to create a positive experience for Lions and Leos. If determined more time is required to ensure the product is in an optimal state, the dates may be adjusted accordingly.

**If you don't see the email in your everyday inbox, please check all spam and junk folders for it first before contacting Member Support.

Note that the new Lion Portal will require a unique, unshared email, and phone numbers will no longer be supported as a log in credential.




A Message from 2nd Vice District Governor Paul Scheetz

Club Information for the Governor

At this time of year, clubs are electing new officers. When the clubs know who their new officers will be, the club secretary should login to LCI and input the information and inform the district of the names and office the person is holding, telephone number, and email address of the individuals as soon as they are known. Club meeting times and locations should also be submitted. If any information changes throughout the year, please notify the district secretary so the updated information can be passed along to the clubs in the district. This information is also used by the District Governor to schedule official visits. The Governor contacts the clubs to verify time and location for the meetings. At the same time, the governor may inform the club president of recognitions he or she will be presenting to the club or a club member. The governor will ask the club president if there are any local recognitions to be presented. He or she could also induct new club members.

The directories are used by club presidents and secretaries to assist them throughout the year if they need to contact a trustee for one of the state projects, a district or state committee, or another club.

When the governor sets up a club visit, the only speaker for that meeting is the governor. That club visit is the governor's night. When the governor contacts the club, he/she will want to know if there is a meal. If the governor travels from one end the district to the other for the visit. He or she will want to know how to plan their meals.



A Message from PDG Richard McKellar

To all Lions of District 25C:

In the past, District C did not have a problem finding someone who was qualified and willing to step up to higher lion leadership. This is no longer true.

This article is a call out for someone who is interested in becoming a zone chair, second vice district governor, first vice district governor and eventually district governor.

The candidate should have solid, positive experience, i.e. a minimum of five years as a lion and have served in some capacities that would be learning experiences about lions and how they operate, including the district and international levels.

In Addition, the lion must meet the following Lions Club International criteria listed below:

- Must have served two years as a board member.
- Must have served one year as a club president.
- Must have served one year as a zone chair (president first, then zone chair, as movement to zone chair criteria requires that a person serve one year as a club president first)
- · Or, one additional year as a district officer,

With none of the above being served concurrently.

The above listing covers the "five years-experience" mentioned in the previous paragraph to the "list". This movement through four or five "chairs" gives the lion the experience they need to become a district governor and move the district forward in a positive way.

At the February district convention, a motion was passed to begin interviewing, relative to experience and qualifications according to LCI criteria, all lions stepping forward.

We have experienced, in the past situations where potential candidates had to either step back because it was found that they were not qualified according to Lions Clubs International (LCI) criteria Or, in a second case, a lion who had to serve as a zone chair for 1.5 years because, one of the criteria requires that a zone chair position be served one year under one district governor. We need the candidate to go down the appropriate pathway to district governor, it is more efficient.

There are currently 20 Past District Governors in the district, who are willing to guide and direct you in your endeavor.

ZONE CHAIRS

Zone chairs are the link between the clubs and the district leadership. I believe this link has been broken mostly because we as district leaders have failed to produce good training sessions with emphasis on participating.

If you have ever looked at the Lions Club International zone chair training module you would ask how could one person do all that is listed there. You would be right in your thinking, especially in District C where each zone chair has up to eight clubs to care for. The job as it currently exists is much too large for an individual lion with that many clubs to do all the items by their self.

Several lions are meeting to lay out what is important for zone chairs to accomplish during their year and alternately, trying to determine what the clubs need to do to be a growing, successful club.

If we can make the list short, but productive, and can energize zone chairs to participate, then we have gone a long way in helping the clubs be more successful which in turn makes the district more successful.

One way to energize is to have a training session that breaks all that needs to be done into three segments: "Mandatory" (really needs to be done), "Needed", "Would like".

A short listing in each segment would go a long way in directing the efforts of the zone chair who, if having the time could also move on to "needed", etc.

In order to adjust the load we would need to increase the number of zones with only three or four clubs per zone.
