### **Clinton and Cayuga Lions Clubs**

The Clinton and Cayuga Lions Clubs have once again provided free vision screening to students enrolled in grades 1, 3, 5, and 8 as mandated by Indiana Senate Enrolled Act 533, which states that students in those grades be checked for possible vision problems. Both near and far vision is checked along with testing to determine if the student has problems associated with depth perception or lazy eye, which if not detected, may lead to blindness.

Equipment used by the screening teams consists of Optic 5000 vision machines, Snellen, LEA and Sloan letter and symbol charts as well as the Stereopsis equipment used for depth perception and lazy eye testing. No medicine or eye drops are used in administering any of the tests.

Schools in Vermillion, Parke, and Fountain counties are currently visited by our screening team each year. This year our program began on Monday, November 8, 2021, and ended Monday, November 22, 2021. A total of 968 screenings were conducted with 275 referrals made for follow up testing or treatments. Since our program began in 2007, a total of 21, 181 screenings have been conducted with 5,068 referrals made. The nurse at each school visited is given the screening forms at the conclusion for her records. The only information the screening team maintains are the total number of students screened and the number or referrals.

The Lions School Vision Screening Program not only provides a valuable service to the students and their families, but also greatly aids the school nurse by freeing up time she would normally spend doing the screenings to attend to other duties she must conduct each day. The vision screening program falls under the direction of the Indiana State Board of Health, Indiana Department of Education and the State Legislature. All screeners are trained each year prior to visiting the schools.
