Call for Special District Meeting

Message from Indiana Lions Foundation and Holding Corporation

Indiana Lions Foundation Holds Annual Christmas Luncheon with State Fair Gate Captains

Trustees and guests met for a delightful and delicious Christmas luncheon at the Carmel Lions Clubhouse on Saturday, December 15th. PID Doug Lozier and Foundation President Kathy Lozier prepared two delicious meat entrees and trustees provided the sides, salads and desserts. State fair gate captains and their spouses and friends were the guests of honor at the luncheon and were invited to provide their suggestions on how to make our annual manning of state fair entry gates an even better experience for them and our volunteers. PDG Don Cooper unveiled the 2025 state fair volunteer pin, which he designed. This pin is spectacular and will be a much sought after souvenir item next year!

Prior to the luncheon, the trustees met to review various committee reports including our financial health, which remains very solid. PCC Sue Topf is accepting applications from those with state fair credits for the purpose of receiving a \$200 unrestricted grant to any club, any of the five state projects, LCIF or the Indiana Lions Foundation. A minimum of ten credits is required for these unrestricted grants.

The Foundation approved four matching grants. The Williamsburg club will receive \$1,000 towards a \$2,000 project for the purchase of books for every student at a local elementary school. The Worthington club will receive a \$1,000 grant toward a \$9,100 project to place memorial wreaths on the graves of over 600 veterans in their local cemetery. The Sullivan County club will receive a \$1,000 grant towards the funding of a \$7,700 dyslexia training initiative for teachers in Sullivan County elementary schools. The Whiting club will receive a \$1,000 grant towards a \$6,168 storywalk project in the Whiting city park.

If you are planning to attend the upcoming Mid-Winter Conference in Indianapolis, please stop by our table and visit with one or more of the trustees to learn more about how the Foundation can help fund your club's charitable projects. You may also view the updated Lions Foundation license plate design, which will be effective on January 1, 2025.


