Hello Fellow Lions,

If you read nothing more than this opening sentence, I will be pleased because my question to you is, "HAVE YOU ASKED ONE?".

I'm pretty sure that the answer from most is NO. Why do I think so, well there are 51 clubs in our district and 44 of those have not added a new member in the past year. We are not going to be able to offer more service to our communities if we don't have new hands to help do the work and the easiest way to get just one new member is by asking.

Where do we go from here? The Governor has set a goal to be positive membership this year and that means at least plus one. Let me share a few numbers with you.

We currently have 1,302 members and at the same time last year it was 1,307. The mountain isn't too difficult, but it will take effort by all clubs.

The bright spots versus a year ago July 31st. Clinton + 9, Young America +4, Zionsville +9, Riley +6, Poland +3, Plainfield +2, Brownsburg +3.

Now, let's see if we can get a little more upbeat with the news. Have you tried an "Open House", asking people to stop by and have a coffee or soft drink and share the news of what Lions do? Do you invite non-members to participate in eye screening or other service projects? Volunteers become good members. Don't be bashful, spread the news about what Lions do and others will want to be a part of it.

Lastly, Any Club that signs 3 or more new members, call me and I will come induct them for you.

A Message from GST

2024-2025 GST Goals

District C comprises 51 clubs with a total membership of 1302. Of the 51 clubs, only 16 reported service for the month of July.

District Governor John has set a goal of 100% reporting.

We have spent the last few years sharing service ideas trying to address the needs of aging club members and especially when the pandemic made many service projects impossible to carry out. I believe most clubs have reestablished their service projects and are meeting the needs of their communities.

We now need to focus on getting those clubs to report their service hours, first by determining why some clubs refuse to report their hours and then making sure they have the tools and training to accomplish this activity.

My goal is to gather teams by Zones to address these needs. I believe this is where we can enlist the services of the PDGs along with current and past zone chairs. These teams will need to be multi-disciplinary, with some who enjoy reaching out to others, some who are computer savvy and those who have a teaching heart.

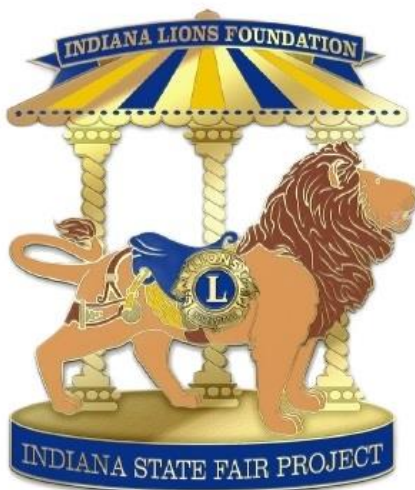
Check to see when your State NP reporting is due. (It depends on the last digit of your FEIN). This is no longer an annual filing.

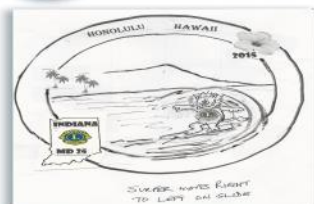
