

Zionsville Lions Club and the Cox Cemetery Restoration Update

A recent work session resulted in a number of bases being reset and some headstones It is beginning to look like a mounted. cemetery. The picture to the left is showing a greater number of stones. As we find them, we stabilize and level the base then mount the headstones if we can find them (some have been buried). This picture shows about 1/3 of the cemetery. Note the base of a very large stone by the tree to the far right. There are four or five of these in the Cox cemetery. We are leaving them to the last because we will need a tripod/chain to lift and maneuver them. As you can also see, there are a number of headstones lying flat on the ground. These are broken and need repair before they can be mounted. (Photo by Lion Ruth Kelly; text by PDG Dick McKellar)



The reset headstones were cleaned with a special solution. They sparkled and looked like new.

This picture is showing an area under restoration. All of these bases are being removed, lined up, reset and stabilized. Notice the "crevice" in the base at the bottom of the picture. Every base has a crevice. The headstone is mounted down into the crevice without mortar and is held there by gravity only. The depth is about 2.5 inches. The headstone just below the tree cannot be mounted at this time because it was broken off right at the top of the crevice. That leaves a stone "plug" that will have to be chiseled out before the headstone can be mounted. Because of the angle at the bottom, the headstone will have to be made square or the headstone will lean. This base was buried about 12 inches deep. It was dug up, cleaned up, reset, leveled and stabilized. The headstone, slightly buried about 4 feet away, was then remounted. (Photo by Lion Ruth Kelly and text by PDG Dick McKellar)

#### **COVID RIBBON MEMORIAL**

The display will include over 12,600 brightly colored ribbons each representing a life lost over the past year. Special ribbons will be added to the display to honor Indiana Lions who have lost their lives to this dreaded disease. It is hoped the display will impress upon everyone who sees it that the true extent of Indiana's loss is more than just a number published daily in our newspapers. The Zionsville Lions Club Ribbon Project is being constructed by Senior Service Committee members and volunteers. The project will be portable and made available to other organizations who might also wish to use the display.


