25C Receives Reporting Accolades

Way to go, District C! I am so very proud of you! District 25C ranked 7th in a Service Reporting Contest of all the Districts in Constitutional Area 1 (which is North America.) Thank you to all who had a hand in making this happen, and it takes a lot of people doing excellent work for this to occur! Some may wonder how we are able to succeed at such a high level, so let me share how we do it.

On the 20th of each month, District GST PID Linda Tincher sends out an e-mail to the secretaries reminding them about the monthly reports. Approximately 5 days later zone chairs encourage their clubs to wrap up their reporting. Then on the last day of the month, the VDGs lend a hand to the zone chairs in making calls to those clubs that wait until the last minute. That's three messages across eight to ten days; the average person probably gets more messages than that daily! Nevertheless, I understand some people may think that's too much.

With that in mind I offer the following solution: GET THE REPORTING DONE EARLIER IN THE MONTH! For instance, on the first day of the month, log in and report "No changes" in Membership, if you haven't gained a new member. That checks your box and does NOT prevent you from adding new members or making changes the



rest of the month. (If nothing happens that month, your report is done.) As for the Activity Report, find something a member in your club has done—it does not have to be the entire club nor a big thing—early in the month, just report it! It can be small: raking leaves, for example, reading a book to someone, mowing someone's lawn, delivering groceries. It all counts! It's entirely possible after your first meeting of the month you could have your reports completed and can joyfully delete any reminding e-mails and never get a phone call!




One Minute for Membership




