Message from CC Bob Hrdy

August 23, 2023

To: MD 25 Past District Governors

Re: International Director Application and Endorsement

There has been an expression of interest from Senior Lions International Leadership in a potential International Director from the State of Indiana.

In line with our State Lions Constitution and By-laws, as amended at the Indiana Lions Convention in 2022, (Article II, Candidates for International Office), the MD 25, 2023-2024 Council of Governors voted on July 22, 2023, at the first Council Meeting to open the required endorsement period for the position of International Director to all Indiana Past District Governors.

The Lions International Constitution and By-laws states that notification of endorsed candidates must be submitted 60 days prior to the beginning of the International Convention. The 2024 Indiana Lions Convention will be held on April 26-28, 2024. This date is less than the required 60 day notice. Therefore the decision was made to open the required endorsement period now.

Candidates should forward their Candidate Letter and Club endorsement to their District Governors and PCC Sue Topf, State Administrative Secretary.

- Submit your Candidate letter/Qualifications to your Club President, for your Club's Endorsement.
- If endorsed, your letter and your Club's Endorsement letter must be forwarded to your district Governor for The District Endorsement.
- If endorsed by the District, the District Governor will forward the endorsement packet to the Council Chair (CC Bob Hrdy) and a copy to the State Nominations and Elections Chairperson (PDG Barbara Toosley).
- The State Nominations and Elections Committee shall review the qualifications of each candidate for Convention Endorsement.

2023-2024 Council Chair Bob Hrdy requires this District endorsement to be received by no later than midnight Sunday, December 3, 2023.

If MD 25 has one or more qualified candidates, a Special Convention will be convened at the January, 2024, Mid-Winter Conference for the sole purpose of endorsing a candidate for International Director. This will be done in order to meet the 60 day timetable set forth by Lions International.

The Special Convention will be called in accordance with the International Association of Lions Clubs, Constitution and By-Laws, Standard Multiple District, Fiscal Year 2022-2023, revised June 23, 2022, Article VII-Multiple District Convention: section 4. SPECIAL CONVENTION.

It is a great honor for us and our State, so let's get ready to place another great Hoosier Lion on the Board of Lions International.

Martinsville Lions

Martinsville Noon Lions Receive \$150,000 LCIF Diabetes Grant

The Martinsville Noon Lions Club has partnered with the Diabetes Youth Foundation of Indiana to construct a cabin at "Camp Until-A-Cure" in Noblesville, Indiana. The formal announcement was made during the 82nd Annual PDG John Hurt Cookout on September 13, 2023 at the Jimmy Nash City Park in Martinsville.

Lions Cabin is a 2-unit handicapped accessible cabin which is capable of housing up to 10 campers on each side. Each unit shall have its own restroom and shower, and the cabin will be heated and cooled to allow camping into the off-season months. In addition, Lions Cabin will feature a laundry facility to serve the entire camp.


The cabin is being constructed in memory of Lion Roger Chalkley and PCC Terry Maxwell, both former members of the Martinsville Noon Lions Club, and the cost of the project is estimated at \$204,000. Funding for the project has been made available through memorial contributions received from the Martinsville Noon Lions Foundation, the District 25C Diabetes Committee, the Multiple District 25 Diabetes Committee, the Indiana Lions Foundation, the Spencer Lions Club, the Diabetes Youth Foundation of Indiana, and a \$150,000 matching diabetes grant received from Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF).

At the cookout, PCC Ross Drapalik gave a brief history of this partnership and the process of raising the \$50,000 matching funds and obtaining the \$150,000 LCIF grant. Jenna White, the Executive Director of the Diabetes Youth Foundation of Indiana, talked about the camp and its mission of serving children ages 5-15 years with Type 1 Diabetes. The camp helps kids learn to manage diabetes and allows them to just be kids.

The ground breaking for the cabin is expected in early October with the dedication of the cabin hoping to be the weekend of the 2024 State Lions Convention in Noblesville.

The Martinsville Noon Lions Foundation is an IRS 501(c) (3) charitable organization, and tax deductible donations can be sent to P.O. Box 1062, Martinsville, Indiana.



A Message from Indiana Lions Speech and Hearing



ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM INDIANA LIONS SPEECH AND HEARING, INC.



The disciplines of Audiology, Speech-Language Pathology, and American Sign Language/English Interpreting include trained specialists providing services in a variety of educational and healthcare settings. Each year brings new knowledge and advancements that will help individuals overcome difficulties associated with speech, hearing, and language deficits. Advances in medicine and an increasingly aging population necessitate numerous additional professionals in these fields.

Colleges and universities throughout the United States offer degrees in these fields. A degree in one of these areas requires a minimum of a Bachelor's Degree. Encouragement by Lions throughout Indiana may be a decisive factor in a career choice for an Indiana youth to select one of these professions. Indiana Lions Speech and Hearing, Inc. (ILSH) may provide scholarships of \$750.00 per student for up to four students per academic year. Students who are entering their junior year or above are eligible to apply for this scholarship. If more than four applicants per year, the scholarships will be awarded based on academic achievement. Please refer to the eligibility requirements listed on the application for further information.

Students are eligible to receive the scholarship for a maximum of two years. Renewals are not to be considered automatic. The student must repeat the application process to be considered for a scholarship for the second year.

Once approved for the scholarship, the student will be notified by one of the Trustees of Indiana Lions Speech & Hearing, Inc. A check will be issued and sent to the appropriate department at the university in which the student is enrolled.

FOR A STUDENT TO BE ELIGIBLE, S/HE MUST:

- Be majoring in a program in the field of Audiology, Speech-Language Pathology, or American Sign Language/English Interpreting;
- Be entering their 3rd or 4th year in said program, or into graduate school at an accredited college or university offering a minimum four year degree in one of the above mention fields;
- Make application to a ILS&H Trustee or Indiana Lions Club and be sponsored by a Lions Club in Indiana;
- Demonstrate an accumulative GPA of a 3.0 on a 4.0 scale or higher;
- Werification of meeting eligibility requirements by University advisor or department faculty member;
- Submit an essay of at least 200 words explaining how the scholarship will be used.

FOR A LIONS CLUB TO PARTICIPATE, THEY MUST:

- Promote career paths consistent with ILSH scholarship program and seek out deserving students who may require financial support;
- Consider providing financial support in addition to the \$750 from Indiana Speech & Hearing, Inc.;
- Furnish eligibility date and the recommended support to a District Trustee of Indiana Lions Speech & Hearing, Inc. 120 days prior to the enrollment date;
- Recommend the student for scholarship renewal for the second year with satisfactory progress and the club's continued support; and
- Complete the application form.
