For those who are newer to Lionism, the Indiana Lions Foundation (ILF) is the non-profit arm of Indiana Lions and it exists to help the districts and the state projects

carry out their charitable purposes. It accomplishes this by funding matching grants for Lions projects both at the local club level and for state projects. The ILF funds the grant requests through donations from clubs and members, Lions license plates, and through the volunteer labor of Lions at the Indiana State Fair. As of this writing, the ILF still has a number of open slots needing Lions to fill them. For a few hours of your time, you get free on-site parking and admission to the Fair. 
The Indiana Lions Foundation also recognizes Lions with the W.P. Woods Fellowship is named for the Evansville, Indiana resident and first president of Lions International. A Lions Club or a Lion member in good standing can nominate someone to receive the Fellowship and the recipient does not need to be a Lion. The nominator must have contributed to the ILF, either monetarily or through work credits from the State Fair. The Foundation provides a certificate and plate recognizing the individual for their contribution to Lionism. This can be an excellent way to thank a long time Lion for their service to your club or to thank a community leader for their support of your club efforts. 

We can learn how to be leaders by picking up ideas, hints and learning along the way, seeing things we would change and gathering ideas for the future. I have never


regretted accepting a position, and I'm always looking for new and perhaps different ways to do things.

In fact, looking back, about all I could say about Lions is a lot of towns I had driven through in my life had an emblem on the "Welcome to ..." sign along with many other organizations.



When I did attend that first meeting, it turned out I knew five members besides my soon to be sponsor.

So the focus this month is to "Be Visible". Lions everywhere are doing great things and with a great attitude. But I think most of us are doing this to truly help other and not to get any accolades. This servant mentality is fantastic, but people aren't going to join if they don't know who Lions are or the good work they are doing. - 1. Wear something with a Lions logo such as a hat or shirt. People will ask about it.
- 2. Get a Lions license plate with a clever custom number (mine is ROAR42)
- 3. Find a way for your Club to do visible service in the community possibly by partnering with other local organizations.
- 4. Get articles about all service your Club does into your local news outlets.
- 5. Chat with people about ways they'd like to help the community. You can follow up with them later and let them know you were thinking about what they said and may have a way to help.
- 6. Ask them an indirect question. My favorite is "Who do you know that is looking for a way to help the community?".
- 7. Have a member information night that showcases the service your Club does. Along with this have a Club contest to see who can bring the most guests to this event.
- 8. Or other ways I haven't thought of. If you have ideas, please let your Club President and me know. I'd love to hear them.

Whatever you do to be a little more visible, have fun doing it. Thank you for being a Lion. Thank you for all of the time and energy you put into your Club and your community. Thank you for helping others understand Lionism.






The celebration will start at 12:00 noon in Harter Park, In Union City, Indiana with the dedication of the new covered bridge.
